

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

We have an attendance system in place for all students from Kindergarten to Grade Twelve to ensure that all of our students arrive at school safely. Our morning supervision begins at 8:35 a.m. and we request that our town students do not arrive at school before that time. Our bus drivers have also targeted their arrival time for 8:40-8:45 a.m.

A Spartan Shout Out to Miss Columbia Garbutt and Miss Elisabeth Bechtold, interns who will be in Miss Whitell's and Mrs. Bredy's classes respectively until Christmas. For the month of September, the familiar face of Mrs. Shelly Eckstein will be gracing the halls of Eaton until the return of our Counsellor Mrs. Sandi Toner. Eaton School Staff recognize that Coronavirus has impacted everyone differently and that the mental health of our students and staff is of utmost importance as we return to school after a very challenging spring. We will also be focusing on determining where our students are at, using resources and a variety of teaching strategies to meet our students' needs. We certainly missed being in the classrooms with each and every one of our students and could hardly wait for the first day of classes.

September 8th was such a great day! We were all back together for the first time since March 16th – that's about 175 days! I was so thrilled to be back with my Spartan Family. Elementary students have 2 - 15 minute outdoor recesses, weather permitting.

Gr 7-12 students have 7 minute breaks between periods.

Attendance in the high school end will be taken at the beginning of every class. Attendance in the elementary end will be taken at the start of the morning and afternoon.





This is a guide only; the specifics of each case will be assessed and at times may result in a different decision than indicated above.

Definitions:

<u>Self-Monitor</u>: monitor yourself for symptoms of respiratory illness, such as fever, cough, sore throat and difficulty breathing. Avoid crowded places and increase your personal space from others when possible.

<u>Self-Isolate</u>: stay at home, monitor yourself for symptoms for 14 days, avoid all contact with others and follow local public health authority advice.

<u>Close contact</u>: provided direct care to someone or had direct contact with infectious body fluids of a person without consistent and appropriate use of recommended PPE, lived with or had prolonged contact with a probable or confirmed case.

Casual contact: being in the presence of or having limited direct contact for minimal period/s of time.

Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment

FAIR NOTICE

Sun West School Division is committed to creating and maintaining school environments in which students, staff, parents/guardians/caregivers and others feel safe. Schools cannot ignore any threat of violence.

What is a threat?

- An expression of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something
- May be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the Internet, or made by gesture

Duty to Report

To keep school communities safe and caring, staff, parents/guardians/caregivers, students and community members must report all threat related behaviors to the school principal.

What is the purpose of a Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment?

- To ensure and promote the emotional and physical safety of students, staff, parents, the student making the threat, and others
- To ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat
- To understand the factors that contribute to the threat maker's behavior
- To be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the threat maker
- To promote the emotional and physical safety of all

What behaviors warrant a Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment to be initiated?

A Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment will be initiated for behaviors including, but not limited to:

- Serious violence or violence with intent to harm or kill
- Verbal/written threats to harm or kill (clear, direct, and plausible)
- Online threats to harm or kill others
- Possession of weapons (including replicas)
- Bomb threats (making and/or detonating explosive devices)
- Fire starting
- Sexual intimidation or assault
- Gang related intimidation and violence

What Parents and Students Need to Know?

- Any threat must be reported to the school principal
- Investigation may involve the student services counsellor, the police of jurisdiction, or other community agencies
- Investigation may involve locker or personal property searches
- Interviews will be held with the threat maker and other students or adults who may have information about the threat
- Parents of students who are directly involved will be notified
- Threatening behavior may result in disciplinary action
- An intervention plan may be developed for the student making the threat and a support plan developed for any individuals targeted by threats.

The information in this brochure reflects the thinking and work of J. Kevin Cameron, Director of the Canadian Centre for Threat Assessment and Trauma Response.
