They listened to a story about family on Christmas Day 150 years ago and saw what they needed to do to prepare for Christmas and learned what they would have received as gifts. 









Grade 1 & 2 have picked out their new word to focus on for 2023! We are looking forward to working towards our goals .














2022 SPARTAN CHRISTMAS TURKEY DINNER




