### TOWN OF EATONIA BYLAW NO. 2/19

## A BYLAW TO RECOVER PROTECTIVE SERVICES COSTS

The Council of the Town of Eatonia in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw shall be known as the "Protective Services Cost Recovery Bylaw".
- 2. In this bylaw:
  - a) "Administrator" shall mean the administrator of the municipality;
  - b) "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality; and
  - c) "Municipality" shall mean the Town of Eatonia.
- The cost of fire prevention, suppression and emergency response services shall be charged directly on the persons who receive the service in accordance with Schedule "A" which is attached to and forming a part of this bylaw.
- 4. The Council may authorize the Administrator to add to the taxes of any property owned by the person referenced in Section 3 of this bylaw any amount which remains unpaid at the end of the calendar year or 90 days after the person has been invoiced for said services, whichever is earlier.
- 5. This bylaw shall come into effect on January 1, 2020.
