- Carbon Controls was out to replace the variable frequency drives at the water treatment plant. Everything seems to be working fine. All water levels and consumption are good.
- Water line break in front of the old booster station. Parts to repair it should be here this week. When digging to repair it on Saturday, the crew hit an exposed gas line. Talked to Sask Energy



- and the town will be billed for the cost. Will be around \$2000.
- Repairing curbstops at 3 4 places. Need to order a tool to pull in the water line to a house. Right now there is a water line leaking on the property owner's side. The tool will cost around \$2000. Good to have it on hand as it can be used in the future.
- Concrete at the lagoon all crushed to the dollar amount approved (\$18,000 all in which included crushing and hauling). Still a bit more to crush.
- ► Leaking gas line at arena is all repaired. Vac truck and Eston Sheet Metal were about \$3500 to fix it.
- Sewer cleaning at EOL on Saturday. Glove and a rag was found in the line. Only took an hour to snake it out.
- Sweeper is all torn apart to repair. Dean is putting it all back together. Will have it done by the end of the month.
- Rob is going to call Dean back in March to help pull the pump at the lagoon.
