TAX PENALTY

As per Bylaw No. 7/07, a 1% penalty will be added in September to all current taxes outstanding.

TOWN OF EATONIA RECEIVES BUILDING CANADA FUND GRANT

The town received funding from the federal and provincial government to replace 4 blocks of watermain and paving. HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE RECYCLE DAY

On September 16, 2009 the R.M. of Newcombe, R.M. of Snipe Lake, R.M. of Chesterfield, Town of Eston and Town of Estonia along with the Product Care Association are hosting a Household Hazardous Waste Round-Up day at the R.M. of Newcombe shop in Glidden from 9 am to 4 pm.

Ratepayers from the municipalities can dispose of adhesives, aerosols, automotive bi-products, batteries, cleaners, corrosives, fuels, mercury, oxidizers, poisons, pharmaceuticals, propane cylinders, solvents, paint, and electronics waste. Stop by the town office for a detailed list of items that they will accept.

The reductions of household hazardous waste in our landfills will benefit our municipalities and towns now, and for future generations to come.

NOMINATION DAY

This is the year to elect a municipal council. Nominations may be filed for any time during regular town office hours from the posting of call for nominations until the deadline of 4:00 p.m. on nomination day, September 30, 2009. Watch for the ad and posters for the Call of Nominations.





A person can be nominated as a candidate for mayor or councillor if he or she is:

- At least 18 years old on Election Day;
- A Canadian citizen;
- A resident of the municipality for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day nomination papers are submitted; and
- A resident of Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day nomination papers are submitted.

The candidate's nomination paper must be signed by at least five electors of the town. Stop by the town office for a nomination paper after the posting of the call of nominations.

It is important to become involved in your community's affairs and exercise your democratic right to choose the leaders of your community. Become involved in your future.
