## MAINTAIN YOUR PROPERTY

It is your responsibility to control the weeds and mow the grass on and around your property including the boulevard and back lane. You are not to let garbage and litter accumulate on your property. Please keep your property looking neat and tidy, or as per the Nuisance Abatement Bylaw No. 6/09 you will be served with an Order to Remedy.

## **BYLAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER**

Pam Wake, Bylaw Enforcement Officer, can be contacted at 460-8908 if you have a complaint. When making a complaint, you must be willing to give your name. This information will be kept confidential. Anonymous complaints will not be handled.

## **BURNING IN TOWN**

As per Bylaw No. 5/07, proper collection and disposal of garbage, no person shall burn any garbage or refuse within the town limits.

As per the Fire Pit Bylaw No. 3/09, only charcoal, cut seasoned wood, or manufacturer's logs are to be burned in fire pits. You are not to burn leaves, grass clippings, garden refuse, or any material that when burned will generate excessive smoke or an offensive odor. If smoke from a fire causes an unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of another person's property, the fire must be extinguished immediately.

## MOVING AND BUILDING PERMITS

No building or structure shall be built, moved off or moved on to a lot without first applying for and securing a moving or building permit. This applies to any building or structure regardless of the size, whether it is on skids or not, or just a temporary structure. The town council must first approve of the building or structure and it must adhere to the Zoning Bylaw No. 2/82 and the Building Bylaw No. 1/90.

To check for a leaking toilet: Get some food coloring and drop some in the tank of your toilet. Watch the bowl of your toilet for a few minutes to see if any of the food coloring appears. Check again in fifteen minutes. If coloring appears this means you have a slow leak.
