BYLAW UPDATES

Care & Control of Animals Bylaw

Please remember that all dogs and cats are to be licensed, whether they go outside or not and that they are not to "Run of Large", which means i.e.

- (1) in direct and continuous charge of a person competent to control it, or
- (2) securely confined within an enclosure or
- (3) securely fastened so that it cannot room at will.

Remember not all people enjoy pets and do not appreciate picking up after your pet or being approached by a wandering pet when out and about.

Dog / Cat Licensing Importance:

All dogs & cats in the town require a license if spayed / nuitered \$10, 00; neither spayed or niutened \$15, 00; and is to be renewed each January, as a license is good until December 31st of each year. This helps in identifying your pet and may save them from spending the night in the pound. Remember the limit is five dogs &/or cats per household. Not licensing your pets is an infraction of the Bylaw. Penalty (fine) for first offence is \$50.00.

Development Permits:

You must first apply for a Development Permit. No building or structure shall be erected, reconstructed, moved off or moved on a lot nor shall any building structure or land be used for any other use than is permitted in the zoning district concessed, and then only after applying for and securing all development permits, building permits or other permits and licenses required by all bylaws in effect within the municipality.

Business Licenses Bylaw #

Any business that is operating within the town of Eatonia requires a License. This includes out of town contractors / trades people, direct sellers etc. Failure to purchase a license prior to conducting business may result in a fine. Business licenses must be renewed annually.

Noise Bylaw

From the hours of 11:00pm to 7:00pm, no noise is allowed that is loud / unusual or unnecessary and is persistent. There are people who work shift work, etc. Any you should take consideration for this between 7:00am and 11:00 pm at night (playing of music, pets, swining engines, etc.) Talking with your neighbor could save a lot of grief in the long run if you try to be considerate.

Numbers on the Building

To help with 9-1-1 we would like to ask your assistance by putting visible number(s) on all buildings, commercial and residential in front for easy identification of civic (street/avenue) locations.

Regulate Property & Nuisance Abatement Bylaw

It is the responsibility of the property owner to maintain their yards as well as the boulevards and back alley way. Garbage and debus are an immense attraction to rats and other animals therefore this kind of refuse will not be tolerated. Weeds & grass must be cut & maintained. All yards are not kept clean of debus; a letter is mailed to the property owner(s) in which you will have 15 days of the date to get the order done. Should clean up not be completed in the set time frame given, the town does the cleanup and the costs of work are added to the property taxes.



Junked Vehicles:

No property owner shall permit any junked vehicle to be kept on any land owned by that person.

Outdoor Storage of Materials:

Any building materials, lumber, scrap metal, boxes or similar items stored in a yard shall be neatly stacked in piles and elevated at least 0.15meters off the ground so as not to constitute a nuisance or Ralborage for sodents, vermin and insects.

Trees and Shrubs:

Trees and shrubs on your property, including portions hanging off your property are your responsibility to maintain and trim accordingly. Communication among neighbors prior to trimming. Just a reminder to keep your trees and shrubs on the corner lots trimmed to a height of no more than three (3) feet so that the traffic at the intersections can be seen in every direction. Also remember to keep your trees along the sidewalks trimmed, so pedestrians are able to use the sidewalk properly.

Saskatchewan Dutch Elms Disease Regulations.

Observe the annual pruning ban – Do not prune or cut down your elms between April 1st & August 31st. The Elm Bark beetle that spreads the DED fungus is attracted to freshly cut elm and is most active during this period. The DED regulations apply to all elms including Liberian & Manchurian elms.

Mosquitoes and West Niles

Clean up around your property:

- Any type of standing water- needs to be emptied, barrels or tin cans etc. Birdbath water should be changed weekly.
- <u>Swimming of Wading Pools</u> Remove water that collects on pool covers. Turn over washing pools not in use.

- <u>Check</u> and <u>drains</u> Don't let things pile up. Clean leaves & twigs from down & roof gutters throughout the summer. Make sure drainage ditches are not clogged. Check flat roofs for standing water.
- Yard & Lawn Maintenance Cut lawn frequently. Turn over compost frequently. Clean away lawn cuttings, leaves & other debus. Clean out where mosquitoes like to breed and nest.

Traffic Bylaw #2/10

Parking RV Trailers / Boat Trailers

The time frame for parked vehicles on the street is a 72 hours limit / Trailers is a 96 hours limit, and they must be moved. Take consideration for other homeowners, intersections, alleyways etc. Tickets start at \$40.00

Transportation of Waste:

No person may transport waste of any kind along or over any highway, street land or other place in Town of Eatonia unless in a fully enclosed vehicle as the load is fully secured in a manner that will ensure the waste will not leave the load.

Speed limits

In town limits are 40km / hr unless otherwise posted.

All Terrain Vehicles (dirt bikes, quads, etc.)

These vehicles are not allowed (the Highway Traffic Act) to be driven on any highway or within the town limits. To ride on private land, you need their permission in addition to following the rules given under The Highway Traffic Act. Any unregistered vehicle of any kind found in contravention is subject to a fine of \$535.00 as well as the vehicle being seized. In addition, the operation can be fined under the Noise Bylaw.



Burning in fire pits

You must only burn clean wood – no debus / household garbage etc. These fires are to be kept in a proper container and not allowed to get out of control. Please make sure they are properly put out when unattended & do not burn on s.... winding days. Take considerations for your neighbors

Watering

Mowing it the best t.... to water most lawn areas and other plants. Especially before 10:00 am because rising heat later turns to steal a lot of water by evaporation. If the weather gets cool and moist cut down. The simple test is to step on a patch of lawn briefly and see if the grass blades spring back up (no water necessary) or tend to stay plat (time to sprinkle deeply again).

Bylaw #6/10

- Hours for outside watering are 7:00 am to 10:00 pm?????????
- Odd numbered addresses shall be allowed to use water for outdoor purposes on odd numbered calendars days.
- Even numbered addresses shall be allowed to use water for outdoor purposes on even numbered calendar days.
- Water restrictions are in effect January to December of each year.

• Penalties:

- First infraction of this Bylaw is \$100.00 (one hundred dollars)
- Second & subsequent infractions is \$250.00 (two hundred & fifty dollars
