Deeply Rooted Citizens

Fifty-two years ago, many of the trees on small town boulevards in Saskatchewan were Russian Poplars or Manitoba Maples. (The Manitoba Maple of 2010 is a much more respectable individual than the wild Manitoba Maples which were used in shelterbelts early in the past century and whose descendants, unfortunately, are still being planted today.) The standard hedging plants of an earlier time were unruly caraganas and madly suckering lilacs. In the Plant'em and Forgot'em School of Tree Care of the time, these four cultivars had a fair survival rate.

For most of the past century, most people in small towns had little useful knowledge of trees and shrubs. A tree was a tree and a bush was a bush. The requirements for establishing and maintaining what is now called the Urban Forest have become more sophisticated. Trees and shrubs are citizens, too. Some are desirable citizens and some aren't. Manchurian elms aren't. They were planted in Eatonia because they were mistakenly advertised as superior boulevard trees. Like American Elms, they are not to be pruned after March 31 or before September 1. This restriction is intended to limit the spread of the Elm Bark Beetle which can carry the bacillus of the Dutch Elm Tree Disease. (In the 1960s, this disease killed 17,000 of the 23,000 elm trees in Great Britain.) Global warming appears to be bringing warm-climate insect pests north and the globalization of commerce brings new pests from far away places. At risk now in Eatonia are birch trees and the ash trees which have been the preferred boulevard trees for many years.

It is necessary for the town to experiment with different varieties of trees on boulevards and other public areas. New plantings will be marked with orange-tipped stakes in order to identify trees which summer employees will be required to water.

Householders who want to live in a healthy urban forest should keep the following considerations in mind:

- 1. Drought kills trees. The town cannot water every boulevard tree. The role of citizens in protecting trees from drought and physical damage is very important.
- 2. Dripping trees, usually elms or maples are under attack by aphids. Aphids can be killed by spraying trees with soapy water. The same spray is effective against aphids and spider mites in evergreens. Try to avoid using malathion, particularly on evergreens.
- 3. If you can't identify the tree you wish to prune, the Town Office can arrange to have it identified.
