## Town of Eatonia Bylaw Enforcement Updates

### Elm Trees:

Now is the time to trim your Elm trees. Take advantage of the weather and trim your elms now before the snow flies. Once the spring thaw arrives it will be too late! Remember trees cannot be pruned between April 1<sup>st</sup> and August 31<sup>st</sup> to prevent **Dutch Elm Disease**. Any trees and shrubs on your property, including portions hanging off your property are your responsibility to trim and maintain accordingly. This includes sidewalks and alleys.

### Animal Control Bylaw:

Remember that dogs are to be leashed at all times when walking anywhere around town, including play grounds. You never know when something will startle your pet or they may not like another animal. Be safe. Pets can get aggressive under certain situations. Also please remember to pick up your pets defecates. Always carry a bag with you.

### Noise Bylaw:

From the hours of 11:00p.m. to 7:00a.m. no noise is allowed that is loud / unusual or unnecessary and is persistent. There are people who work shift work, etc. and you should take consideration for this between 7:00a.m. and 11:00p.m. playing of music, pets, revving engines, etc. Talking with your neighbor could save a lot of grief in the long run if you try to be considerate.

### Transportation of Waste:

No person shall transport waste of any kind along or over any highway, street, lane or other place in the Town of Eatonia or enroute to the Town’s Waste Site unless in a fully enclosed vehicle or the load is fully secured in a manner that will ensure the waste will not leave the load. All waste containers at businesses, etc., should be covered at all times to prevent spreading garbage.

## R. M. of Chesterfield No. 261 - N E W S

### ROADS

The rural municipal council has been negotiating the Saskatchewan Highways & Transportation for an **Alternate Truck Route (ATR)** compensation package. September 10, 2010 the agreement was ratified with terms:

- **RM will receive \$31,800 annually** (\$1,200 per kilometer x 26.5 km.)
- **ATR** begins at Hwy. 44 a mile north of Eatonia, runs west 11 miles to Hwy. 44 south east of Mantario
- **2 miles of Hwy. 44** (north of Sections 23, 24-26-27-3), part of the ATR, **will allow Primary Weight Loads**
- **1.5 miles of Hwy. 44** (thru. Section 31-26-27-3 and NE 36-26-28-3) also part of the ATR **will allow Primary Weight Loads**
- hauling overweight loads across the restricted Hwy. 44 and across Hwy. 21 at 6 locations will be allowed **without the need for a permit from the RM**
- hauling secondary weight loads or winter weight loads on the Restricted Hwy. 44 will be allowed to local traffic **with a permit**

### PHOSTOXIN

The municipality hopes to sponsor an *Aluminum Phosphide* training course later this year or early next year, but also reminds farmers wanting to purchase Phostoxin from the municipality of the following:

- a **valid Pesticide Applicator Licence (Special – on-farm fumigation)** must be presented in order to purchase the chemical
- **licence renewal applications** should be forwarded to Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture, Crops Branch, Room 125, 3085 Albert Street, Regina, SK S4S 0B1; the telephone number for the department is 306-787-4662.
- **Gopher Control Rebate Program** applications must be submitted by Nov. 30, 2010; Phostoxin, 2% liquid Strychnine and various other products are eligible.
