

4 Saskatchewan hockey rinks to be powered by Sask Power wind project.

Sask Power has announced four communities that were chosen from more than 150 communities that expressed interest in participating in the project. It's all part of a demonstration project aimed at testing the province's wind potential. The goal is to determine if self-generating electricity will lower power bills associated with operating municipal rinks in each community. The following turbines will be installed and operational in Central Butte, **Eatonia**, Shaunavon and Strasbourg by late summer and will be monitored for up to five years. The wind turbine will be situated on town land SW of town.

### **Mosquitoes and West Nile Virus:**

Clean up around your property:

- Any type of standing water- needs to be emptied, barrels or tin cans etc. Birdbath water should be changed weekly!
- Swimming of Wading Pools Remove water that collects on pool covers. Turn over wading pools not in use.
- Check evestroughs and drains Don't let things pile up. Clean leaves & twigs from down & roof gutters throughout the summer. Make sure drainage ditches are not clogged. Check flat roofs for standing water.
- Yard & Lawn Maintenance Cut lawn frequently. Turn over compost frequently. Clean away lawn cuttings, leaves & other debris. Clean out dense shrubbery where mosquitoes like to breed and nest.

## Health Tips Brought to you by the **Eatonia Primary** Health Care Team of **Heartland Health** Region

Summer is here and along with it comes summer activities. Majority of our kids ride bicycles. Did you know bicycles are associated with more childhood injuries than any other consumer product except an automobile? Bike riders who acquire a head injury are 20 times more likely to die. Bike helmets have been shown to reduce the risk of head injury by 85% and risk of brain injury by almost 90%.

Here are some tips to keep your child safe:

- Buy a helmet that says CSA or CPSC Standards
- Do NOT use second hand helmets
- After a helmet has been in a crash, Replace it
- Make sure helmets fit properly and chin strap is done up snug (fit no more than 1 finger under chin strap)
- Bikes should be in good working condition. Chains oiled, tires have enough air and reflectors are on front, back and pedals
- Teach your kids to walk their bikes across the street, don't ride.

## Eatonia Rec News Cont'd

#### **Important Swimming Pool Info:**

- -Children 5 & under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian
- -"Deep Ends"--Must have obtained Red Cross Swim Level 4 OR
- -Be at least 6 years of age and capable of performing the following:
- Swim four consecutive widths using an appropriate swimming stroke
- -Tread water for a minimum of 1 minute
- -At the Staff's discretion (if swimming ability is in question)
- -To parents, guardians & caregivers: For the safety of yourself, your children & other patrons, we ask that you do not take small children or children without strong swimming abilities into the deep end.

#### **Parents of Preschoolers:**

You must stay within arm's reach of your children at all times.

Water wings, lifejackets and other floatation devices do not replace parental supervision.

Thank you for your co-operation.

These rules are for everyone's safety!

#### **Discipline Policy:**

-A strict discipline policy will be adhered to. Patrons failing to obey all pool rules or any abuse of lifeguards, staff or other patrons will result in the offender being removed from the pool.

#### **Parent Water Safety**

Why is Swimming Important?

~Swimming is a life-long sport

~Swimming promotes multi-generational interaction

~It's fun

**How Can Parents Prevent Accidents?** 

~Enroll children in swim lessons

~Use CSA-approved life jackets

~Make sure children aged five and under are at least an arm's length away or less

~Continuously watch all of your children, no matter what age

#### **Facts that Parents May Not Know**

~Shallow water is the most common area for drowning, especially in water that is three feet deep or less

~Majority of drowning's occur to people who had no intention of entering the water

#### Remember

The lifeguard's duty is to prevent accidents from happening. They are responsible for the overall safety of the facility "you" are responsible for your child's safety.

Farmers needing gopher poison may buy 2% liquid strychnine concentrate from the RM at \$8 per 250 ml. vial. Terms of use are:

- Use ONLY before June 17
- Sign agreement to comply with all terms of use; and
- Sign and return a product evaluation form by July 8

Rebates of 50% of expenses for gopher control are available:

#### Rats

Lockable bait stations, \$15 each are available at the RM office. Bait can be enclosed, making it inaccessible to children & pets.

Hail Insurance Saskatchewan Municipal Hail Insurance Association (SMHI) has set 2011 rates, with most townships lower than last year and lower than line companies.

Specifically, SMHI and AMHI beat the opposition in all but 6 of the 22 townships in RM 261. For a detailed schedule of rates including line company (Butler Byers, Canadian, Co-op., Farmers) comparisons, e-mail or call the RM office.

### Highway 44

The Alternate Truck Route (a mile NE of Eatonia running 16 miles west) is taking much of the heavy traffic off Highway 44. Special permits have been issued to land owners along the restricted portion of Highway 44, enabling access from their property along the highway to the nearest municipal road.
