Cat and Dog Licenses for 2011

Any cat or dog living in the Town of Eatonia requires a license. These licenses must be renewed annually. Remember, if your pet is lost or even hurt, and is wearing their license, contacting its owner is simply a phone call away! If we don't know who the owner is, it makes it very difficult to handle the situation your pet is in. For example, we can't always approve medical attention if required. Please note even if your pet(s) never go outside – they are still required to have a license.

Annual licensing fee for Cat and dog are as follows: Spayed or Neutered Cat and Dog License - \$10.00 Cat and Dog, not spayed or neutered - \$15.00 Failure to license your Cat or Dog - \$50.00 plus the cost of the license for the 1st Offence.

Remember that dogs are to be leashed at all times when walking around town, including playgrounds. You never know when something will startle your pet or they may not like another animal. Be safe. Pets can get aggressive under certain situations. Also please remember to pick up your pets defecates. Always carry a bag.

Business Licenses for 2011

Any business that is operating within the Town of Eatonia is required to purchase a business license prior to conducting business. For example: home based business, out of town contractors/ trades people, transient traders, direct traders, etc. Failure to purchase a license prior to conducting business may result in a fine as per the General Penalties Bylaw. Business licenses must be renewed annually. Home based businesses are also required to obtain a Development Permit first.

Drainage of Excess Water

With the amount of snow in the area we could have a lot of runoff this year. Please be cautious as to where you will be trenching to get water away from your building. Home and business owners are required to pump or trench groundwater onto their lot or to the street or lane.

Parking Time Frame

The parking time frame for any vehicle is 72 hours and then it must be moved. Recreational trailers are not to be parked on any street from November 1st through March 31st. A parked vehicle etc. slows down snow removal. Take consideration for other home owners, intersections, laneways, etc.

Elm Trees

Now is the time to trim your Elm trees. Once the spring thaw arrives it will be too late! Remember trees cannot be pruned between **April 1st and August 31st** to prevent **Dutch Elm Disease**. Any trees and shrubs on your property, including portions hanging off your property are your responsibility to trim and maintain accordingly. This includes sidewalks and alleys. Any boulevard trees are the town's responsibility. Do not trim or prune these trees. Any issues or concerns with boulevard trees contact the town office or the bylaw enforcement officer.

Noise Bylaw

From the hours of 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. no noise is allowed that is loud/ unusual or unnecessary and is persistent. There are people who work shift work, etc. and you should take consideration for this between 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. playing of music, pets, revving engines, etc. Talking with your neighbor could save a lot of grief in the long run if you try to be considerate.

Numbers on Buildings

To help with 9-1-1 we would ask your assistance by putting visible number(s) on all buildings, commercial and residential in front for easy identification of civic (Street/ Avenue) locations.

High Blood Pressure: The "Silent Killer"

Did you know?

High BP can be linked as a cause or contributing factor to more and more health problems affecting your heart, kidneys, and even your brain. High BP can be treated and controlled, which will in turn reduce your risk of heart attack, stroke and other illnesses. Your blood pressure is a number that everyone should be aware of!

What does "blood pressure" mean?

Blood pressure is the force that your heart produces in your arteries as it pumps blood around your body. High BP puts you at a risk for developing narrow arteries.

The "Silent Killer"

Symptoms of high BP sometimes doesn't produce any symptoms, hence the nickname of the "silent killer". It can easily go unnoticed. This is why it is important to have your blood pressure measured. You can do this by asking your doctor to do it for you, by yourself at home with a BP monitor, or even at some pharmacies.

Causes?

As a general rule, if your BP is 140/90mmHg or higher, you could be considered to have high blood pressure. High BP can be caused by an underlying illness, but is more commonly caused by being overweight, high cholesterol, poor diet (excessive amounts of fats and salt), excessive consumption of alcohol, smoking, lack of exercise, and stress or emotional upset. The good news is that you can change or improve all of these factors!
