Did you know.....


The Arena Kitchen Committee is made up volunteers that look after the operations of the kitchen by organizing the workers, ordering, inventory control, cleaning, bookkeeping, etc.

All the proceeds from the kitchen go back to the arena and help cover operation costs, over \$20,000 has been donated in the last 3 years. Without this donation the user fees would increase tremendously. The arena and the arena kitchen rely on our volunteers to help make this happen and everyone's hard work is greatly appreciated.

We would gladly welcome new members, if you are interested in joining please contact any of the Kitchen committee members. We also appreciate any help with kitchen shifts, if you are able to help out there will be a sign up sheet at the arena kitchen.

New Revised Rental Agreement: We now have a new rental agreement in place. A few key items are; Rental-full use of kitchen facilities (not including any supplies) is \$150/day. Kitchen Lobby only is \$75/day. A \$150 damage deposit will be collected in advance and returned upon fulfilling conditions of rental agreement. We require at least 1 week notice for rental requests. Recycle Bin Locations

For Public use there are 4 Bins located Behind the Town Shop & 102 - 2nd Ave East. Single Bins located around Town are for Private Business Use Only! Please Do Not Use Private Business Bins.

Animal Control Bylaw

Remember that dogs are to be leashed at all times when walking around town, including playgrounds. You never know when something will startle your pet or they may not like another animal. Be safe. Pets can get aggressive under certain situations. Also please remember to pick up your pets defecates. Always carry a bag.

<u>Pets</u>

Keep pets inside in extreme temperatures. It takes only <u>minutes to freeze</u> - when the Wind Chill reaches -20 degrees Celsius! Of course this will depend on the size and overall physical condition of your pet. Pets are affected by wind chill the same as humans. Picture yourself without a warm coat on in the winter with no shelter. If your pet is usually an inside pet, they are not acclimatized to outside conditions as you might think. Cat and /or Dog houses MUST BE INSULATED. Pets need to have access to fresh water and food at all times.



Reminder – Numbers on Buildings

To help with 9-1-1 we would ask your assistance by putting visible number(s) on all buildings, commercial and residential in front for easy identification of civic (Street/ Avenue) locations.

Snow Removal for downtown Business

The snow will fly soon so please, remember to remove all snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining the property within 48 hours of a snow fall. Please DO NOT push snow from private or public parking lots into the streets or into any ditches. Snow that cannot be stockpiled on your lot must be hauled away. Know that shoppers and pedestrians appreciate your extra efforts and concerns for public safety. If you have a business for snow removal, you are required to obtain a business license.

Snow Removal for Residential

Snow removal from sidewalks is within 48 hours of a snowfall. The snow is to be removed onto your lot or boulevard and not to be pushed out into the street as it creates driving obstacles and unsafe conditions. If there is no other option, leave the snow in a parking lane and not in the driving lane.

Vehicles

The time frame for parked vehicles is a 72 hour limit then must be moved. A parked vehicle etc. also slows snow removal. Take consideration for other home owners, intersections, alleyways, etc.

Recreational Trailers

The time frame for trailers is a 96 hour limit then must be moved. A trailer is not allowed to be parked on any street from November 1st through March 31st in any year.

Tree Branches

Any trees and shrubs on your property, including portions hanging off your property are your responsibilities to trim and maintain accordingly. This includes sidewalks and alleys.

Garbage Pick:

Front street garbage pick-up will begin on Monday, Nov 7th **Please have your garbage out front by 8:00a.m.**

Don't Slip Now!

Ice and snow are hazardous. Each year, Canadians slip and fall straining muscles and even breaking bones when they are removing snow. Here are a few *Skills for the job of living tips* from occupational therapists to make snow removal safer and easier.



Warm Up Those Muscles

- It is important to stretch the muscles involved in snow shovelling before hand to avoid any injury.
- Stretch your leg muscles, do some spinal stretches and arm swings.
- A light pushing motion of a small amount of snow will also help to prepare and warm up the body for the arctic onslaught that is ahead.

Choose the Right Muscles

- A shovel that is too big for you may mean you have to push and lift 20 pounds of snow; one too small will make 1000 paths and take you much longer.
- Wear proper footwear. Good treads on winter boots are a must.

Good Positioning

 A broad-based grasp with your hands spaced shoulder width apart on the handle will provide you with the leverage necessary to complete the task efficiently.

Add Some Sand or Salt

For hard packed snow, consider adding salt or sand to speed up melting or to provide some traction.

Lifting and Bending

- Always lift with the larger muscles of your legs and bend at your knees. Avoid bending and lifting solely with your back.
- Don't forget to 'breath' when lifting.
- When tossing the snow avoid twisting the back – toss the snow directly in front of you.
- Shovel several smaller and lighter loads rather than one large load.

Don't Overdo it

Shovelling snow is like any strenuous activity. Plan rest breaks throughout. It's not necessary to clear it away as fast as it falls. Pace yourself!
