

Elm Trees:

Now is the time to trim your Elm trees. Take advantage of the weather and trim your elms now before the snow flies. Once the spring thaw arrives it will be too late! Remember trees cannot be pruned between April 1st and August 31st to prevent **Dutch Elm Disease**. Any trees and shrubs on your property, including portions hanging off your property are your responsibility to trim and maintain accordingly. This includes sidewalks and alleys.

Animal Control Bylaw:

Remember that dogs are to be leashed at all times when walking anywhere around town, including play grounds. You never know when something will startle your pet or they may not like another animal. Be safe. Pets can get aggressive under certain situations. Also please remember to pick up your pets defecates. Always carry a bag with you.

<u>Noise Bylaw:</u>

From the hours of 11:00 pm to 7:00am *NO* noise is allowed that is loud / unusual or unnecessary and is persistent. There are people who work shift work, etc. and you should take consideration for this between 7:00am and 11:00pm playing of music, pets, revving engines, etc. Talking with your neighbor could save a lot of grief in the long run if you try to be considerate.

Transportation of Waste:

No person shall transport waste of any kind along or over any highway, street, lane or other place in the Town of Eatonia or enroute to the Town's Waste Site unless in a fully enclosed vehicle or the load is fully secured in a manner that will ensure the waste will not leave the load. All waste containers at businesses, etc., should be covered at all times to prevent spreading garbage.

<u>Reminder :</u>

To help with 9-1-1 we would like to ask your assistance by putting visible number(s) on all buildings, commercial and residential in front for easy identification of civic (Street / Avenue) locations.

Snow Removal for Residential & Business:

The snow will fly soon so please, remember to remove all snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining your property within 48 hours of a snow fall. Please **DO NOT** push snow from private or public parking lots into the streets or into any ditches. Snow that cannot be stockpiled on your lot must be hauled away. Know that shoppers and pedestrians appreciate your extra efforts and concerns for public safety. If you have a business for snow removal, you are required to obtain a business license.

<u>Vehicle and Trailer Parking – The Traffic Bylaw</u> <u>No. 2/10:</u>

Vehicles – 72 Hour Limit All Trailers – 96 Hour Limit No person shall park any vehicle continuously longer than the time specified. Take consideration for other homeowners, intersections, alleyways, etc.

Front street garbage pick-up will begin on Monday, Nov 7th **Please have your garbage out front by 8:00a.m.**



The area north of the South Saskatchewan River is the home of Big Sky Rail, Saskatchewan's 12th and newest shortline railway, serving Laporte to Macrorie west to east and Beechy to Delisle south to north.

"The Government of Saskatchewan is proud to play a role in helping establish this latest addition to the provincial rail transportation network," said Highways and Infrastructure Minister Jim Reiter at the official opening Sept. 22.

"Shortline railways support economic development in rural Saskatchewan, give shippers another option to move their goods and help reduce truck traffic on our busy highways."

Big Sky Rail is a partnership that includes Mobil Grain Ltd., which has been hauling grain cars with locomotives on the track since Sept. 6, and West Central Road & Rail, which has five grain-loading facilities along the shortline and will have an equity position in Big Sky Rail.

"The creation of Big Sky Rail has been a great team effort with CN, Mobil Grain, West Central Road & Rail, and the Government of Saskatchewan," Big Sky Rail President and Mobil Grain President Sheldon Affleck said. "A special thanks goes to CN for encouraging and promoting this shortline railroad. Mobil Grain will market and ship all crops and looks forward to serving farmers in the area."

"We believe this new shortline, under a competitive rate and service structure, will enhance our current operations and open doors to new business opportunities," West Central Road & Rail President and CEO Rob Lobdell said.

Big Sky Rail will receive a \$5.6-million interest-free provincial government loan toward a portion of the purchase of 354 km of track from CN. Big Sky Rail took over operations of these two segments of track from CN in early September, but formal purchase agreements and land title transfers will be finalized later this year.

"This is all about working together to find the most effective way to move grain from southwestern Saskatchewan to export," CN Western Region Senior Vice-president Mike Cory said.

"West Central Road & Rail and Big Sky Rail, with the support of the Government of Saskatchewan, have the local expertise to source the grain that CN will move to markets across North America and around the world."

The Government of Saskatchewan supports shortline rail through programs that include grants for feasibility studies and infrastructure, along with loans to purchase existing track.

Saskatchewan now has 12 shortlines and more than 2,200 km of provincially-regulated track. These provincial shortlines connect to about 6,400 kilometres of federally-regulated rail lines in Saskatchewan.
