


> **Mosquitoes and West Nile Virus:** Clean up around your property:

- Any type of standing water- needs to be emptied, barrels or tin cans etc. Birdbath water should be changed weekly!
- Swimming Wading Pools Remove water that collects on pool covers. Turn over wading pools when not in use.
- Check eavestroughs and drains Don't let things pile up. Clean leaves & twigs from down & roof gutters throughout the summer. Make sure drainage ditches are not clogged. Check flat roofs for standing water.
- Yard & Lawn Maintenance Cut lawn frequently. Turn over compost frequently. Clean away lawn cuttings, leaves & other debris. Clean out dense shrubbery where mosquitoes like to breed and nest.

\*\*When mowing your lawns please do not blow your grass clippings onto the streets\*\*



changes in an attempt to accommodate everyone this year but not without some confusion I'm sure!  $I^{st}$  Set: June 11,13,15,18, 20, 22 (after school) and June 16(morning). Times will be decided once registrations are in.

#### Deadline to register for this set is MAY 30.

2<sup>nd</sup> Set: July 3-6 & July 9-13

3<sup>rd</sup> Set: July 23-27 & July 30-Aug 3

4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Set: Aug 13-17 & Aug 20-24.

These 2 weeks can be taken as a 2-week set or you can chose to register for just one of the weeks. This must be decided at time of registration so instructors can plan accordingly.

Space is limited so register early.

If you have taken lessons from a different provider then Red Cross just mark on the registration form on the last level completed the name of the provider (i.e.: Lifesaving Society, etc.) and the level completed and you will be placed in the appropriate Red Cross level.

Anyone having obtained or enrolled in Red Cross level 9 or 10 (or the equivalent or higher) and thinks they might want to be a lifeguard we would like to give you the chance to find out what it's like. You will work closely with our trained lifeguards and learn what happens in a day at the pool. Depending on how many are interested in this program you may be able work 1, 2 or more days. # <u>EATONIA & DISTRICT RECREATION BOARD</u> <u>SUMMER NEWS 2012 CONT'D</u>

#### Important Swimming Pool Info:

-Children 5 & under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian

-"Deep Ends"--Must have obtained Red Cross Swim Level 4 OR

-Be at least 6 years of age and capable of performing the following:





- Swim four consecutive widths using an appropriate swimming stroke

-Tread water for a minimum of 1 minute

-At the Staff's discretion (if swimming ability is in question)

-To parents, guardians & caregivers: For the safety of yourself, your children & other patrons, we ask that you do not take small children or children without strong swimming abilities into the deep end.

#### **Parents of Preschoolers:**

You must stay within arm's reach of your children at all times.

Water wings, lifejackets and other floatation devices do not replace parental supervision.

Thank you for your co-operation.

These rules are for everyone's safety!

#### **Discipline Policy:**

-A strict discipline policy will be adhered to. Patrons failing to obey all pool rules or any abuse of lifeguards, staff or other patrons will result in the offender being removed from the pool.

#### **Parent Water Safety**

Why is Swimming Important?

~Swimming is a life-long sport ~Swimming promotes multi-generational interaction

~It's fun

How Can Parents Prevent Accidents?

~Enroll children in swim lessons

~Use CSA-approved life jackets

~Make sure children aged five and under are at least an arm's length away or less

~Continuously watch all of your children, no matter what age

#### Facts that Parents May Not Know

~Shallow water is the most common area for drowning, especially in water that is three feet deep or less

~Majority of drownings occur to people who had no intention of entering the water

#### Remember

The lifeguard's duty is to prevent accidents from happening. They are responsible for the overall safety of the facility; you are responsible for your child's safety.

# IMPORTANT NOTE TO PARENTS & GUARDIANS:

~If you are sending children to the pool that can't read please accompany them at least the first time and go over important pool rules, expectations and notices that are posted.

~Vandalism in the change rooms has been increasing over the years and as it is the lifeguards priority to supervise the patrons in the pool they cannot always be watching the change rooms so please explain to your children the importance of respecting the facility so it's not ruined for everyone.

**RINK** -Ice Plant: New condenser, rebuild or replace the 2 compressors with energy efficient models

-Replace furnaces with energy efficient models

-Replace rotting soffit and fascia and repair Zamboni room roof





-new puck board for boards and repairs to player boxes

-Replace aged plumbing fixtures with energy efficient

-exit doors

-Repair arena kitchen roof

-Replace kitchen lobby windows with energy efficient ones

-Replace water-damaged counters and linoleum in concession area

**POOL** -Repair/replace plastic fittings and damaged lines

-Replace filters -Emergency Lighting -Fenced Storage area for empty chemical barrels -Patio Furniture -Solar heating

-General maintenance that arises due to scaling and chemical wear

Not all the work will be done immediately but will prioritized and completed as we can. Donations can be made to the Eatonia Community Services Co-operatives (for charitable tax receipt) or to the Eatonia Recreation Board. 
On May 29<sup>th</sup>, we are expecting the CTV Home Town Tour crew to come visit us. Maybe we will make it on T.V!!
