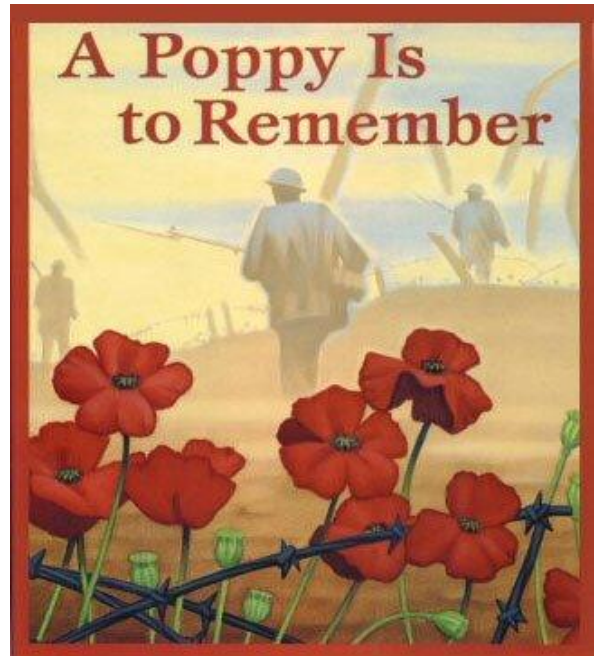

other option, leave the snow in a parking lane and not in the driving lane.

TOWN OF EATONIA NEWS CONT'D

Snow Removal for downtown Business

Since the snow has already arrived please remember to remove all snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining the property within 48 hours of a snow fall. Please DO NOT push snow from private or public parking lots into the streets or into any ditches. Snow that cannot be stockpiled on your lot must be hauled away. Know that shoppers and pedestrians appreciate your extra efforts and concerns for public safety. If you have a business for snow removal, you are required to obtain a business license.

Trailers

The time frame for trailers is a 96 hour limit then must be moved. A trailer is not allowed to be parked on any street from November 1st through March 31st in any year.

Vehicles

The time frame for parked vehicles is a 72 hour limit then must be moved. A parked vehicle etc. also slows snow removal. Take consideration for other home owners, intersections, alleyways, etc.

Animal Control Bylaw

Remember that dogs are to be leashed at all times when walking around town, including playgrounds. You never know when something will startle your pet or they may not like another animal. Be safe. Pets can get aggressive under certain situations. Also

please remember to pick up your pets defecates. Always carry a bag.

Pets

Keep pets inside in extreme temperatures. It takes only minutes to freeze - when the Wind Chill reaches -20 degrees Celsius! Of course this will depend on the size and overall physical condition of your pet. Pets are affected by wind chill the same as humans. Picture yourself without a warm coat on in the winter with no shelter. If your pet is usually an inside pet, they are not acclimatized to outside conditions as you might think. Cat and /or Dog houses MUST BE INSULATED. Pets need to have access to fresh water and food at all times.

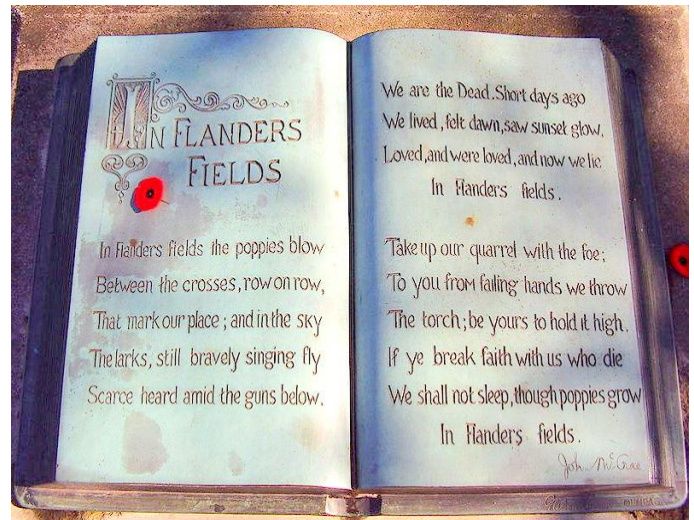

We have a second chance at life, as a family, and as members of this community. We could never have asked for more than being a part of this compassionate, caring, and generous community. This is our lottery.

While I was in the hospital, we both realized that we have never experienced so much love and care, while being so far away from home. As a result, we really believe in the power of people, and it is because of your support, positive messages, and prayer that we are doing so well today. We remember a time when Nichole initially came to town kicking and screaming, thinking about all the prejudices of small town life. We now realize why these stereotypes arise because otherwise everyone would desire to live here! Eatonia is definitely a well kept secret. To us, leaving now would be the absolute worst possible scenario. We have never felt so much love and would now leave here kicking and screaming.

Originally we planned on giving out individual thank-yous, but it is absolutely astounding the countless number of people who have sent us support, prayer, and messages of love. We could easily fill two pages of this newsletter with the names of those who have helped us sustain our little family. Quite simply without the support of this town, Doug and I would've had a deep hole to dig ourselves out of.

We want to mention a few organizations that have also helped us maintain or enhance our preceding life as a family. Based upon what we were told by the doctors in Saskatoon, Nichole owes her life to the Eatonia Fire Department, E.M.T's, first responders, and volunteers. Without their swift and careful actions, we were told Nichole could have easily been a paraplegic or quadriplegic. We would also like to thank Eatonia Oasis Living for generously donating the hospital bed because when one is recovering sleep and independence is so precious. To our community, we are so thankful for your prayers, support and encouraging messages. By the end of all this, our house will smell of flowers and we will be able to judge the best cook of Eatonia contest! We can't even imagine how to start thanking everyone, but we look forward to doing so.

Our final message is that it is funny how life really can change in the blink of an eye. Before the accident, we were talking about how our luck needed to change; it was our time for some good luck.
