RECOGNIZING COLD WEATHER EMERGENCIES

	FROSTBITE
Frostnip 1 st Degree (superficial)	Only top layer of skin freezes, tips of ear, nose, finger etc. Loss of sensation and feeling to area. Firm to touch, pale. Pain on rewarming when thawing. Generally Frostnip isn't serious and is easily cured when removed from cold. Warm area gradually with warm water, not hot and avoid rubbing.
Frostbite 2 nd Degree (partial thickness)	Affects first and second layer of skin. Blisters may appear up to 2 days after. Skin feels hard, waxy, pale and numb. Usually permanent damage is avoided if treated properly. Remove from cold, gradually warm area using body heat or warm water. Don't rub area, and do not thaw area out if chance of refreezing is possible.
Frostbite 3 rd Degree (Full thickness)	Involves all layers of skin, and tissues beneath including nerves and tendons. Hard, numb, waxy, pale skin Use of area is decreased or lost temporarily or permanently. Purple blisters that turn black and are blood filled appear, tissue death may be seen. Permanent damage will result. Remove from cold; Do not thaw if chance of refreezing is possible. Get person to hospital as surgery and amputation is possible.
Treatment Facts to remember:	Massaging or rubbing frozen areas may cause ice crystals in skin to cause more damage. Warm only, remember frozen areas cannot feel hot water or air, and may cause burns. Always remove person from cold, try not to move limb once thawing has started. Seek medical help if needed.
	HYPOTHERMIA
Mild hypothermia Stage 1 (34-36° c) body temp.	Person feels cold, Goose bumps, shivering, decrease in movement person may anger easily, increased heart rate Remove person from cold, remove wet damp clothing, cover with blanket, drink warm fluids if not nauseated
Moderate Hypothermia Stage 2 (32-34° c) body temp.	Shivering, person becomes more agitated, slurred speech, uncoordinated, slow and labored movement, stumbling, falling, mild confusion, not rational (think they're hot). Person becomes pale, lips, fingers and toes may be blue Remove from cold, remove wet or damp clothes, cover with blankets, and drink warm fluids if not nauseated. Handle person with care. Seek medical help
Severe Hypothermia Stage 3 (less than 32° c) body temp.	Shivering stops, impossible to move, confusion, unresponsive to unconsciousness, decreased heart rate, and breathing Remove from cold, remove wet or damp clothes, and cover with blankets. Handle person with care. Seek immediate medical help! This is Life threatening!
Most	hypothermia-related deaths are preventable

Things that affect the body temperature:

Air temperature, Alcohol & Drugs, Humidity, wind, clothing, activity, fluid intake, age, other health conditions. So when heading out in our cold environment, remember to bundle up in layers, Cover fingers, ears and toes. Prepare your vehicle for winter traveling (emergency kit, shovel, blanket, food, etc.). Let someone know where you are going and when to expect you back. Keep an eye on road and weather conditions. And don't leave broken down vehicle and walk out in blinding conditions and become disorientated. **Have a Safe, cozy Saskatchewan winter!!**

<u>Noise Bylaw</u>

From the hours of *11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.* no noise is allowed that is loud/ unusual or unnecessary and is persistent. There are people who work shift work, etc. and you should take consideration for this between *7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.* playing of music, pets, revving engines, etc. Talking with your neighbor could save a lot of grief in the long run if you try to be considerate.

<u>Snowmobile Bylaw</u>

As per Bylaw No. 2/07, **snowmobiles cannot be operated within town limits**. The only exception to operating a snowmobile within town limits is take the quickest, shortest and the most practical route from the point of origin with town limits to a point outside the town limits. No person is to operate a snowmobile within town limits at a speed greater than 20 kilometers per hour and only between the hours of 7:00a.m. and 11:00 p.m. Any persons who contravenes *The Snowmobile Bylaw* or *The Noise Bylaw* can be fined.

<u>All Terrain Vehicles</u> (Quads, dirt bikes, etc.)

These vehicles are not allowed (*The Highway Traffic Act*) to be driven on any highway or within the town limits. To ride on private land, you need their permission in addition to the following rules given under *The Highway Traffic Act*. Any unregistered vehicle of any kind in contravention is subject to a fine of \$535.00 as well as the vehicle being seized. In addition, the operator can be fined under *The Noise Bylaw*.
