Acceptable items to recycle are:

- Fiber products such as box board, card board, paper, newsprint, magazines can go into the bins loose. It does not have to be bagged.
- Tin, plastic and containers need to be bagged before going into the bins. They can be bagged together.
- Shredded paper is to be bagged in a clear bag.

The town council has granted permission to Kindersley Air spray, Colin Bevan, to use the airstrip to provide aerial application services to the farmers during their 2014 growing season.

The following is from a letter Colin submitted to the town council requesting permission to use the airstrip:

I, Colin Bevan, owner of Kindersley Air spray would like to express my gratitude and thanks for the past use of the Eatonia Air strip. Rather than being forced into the questionable practice of using R.M. roads to land and take off from. I feel your public airstrip is a great value in improving public safety, while I am providing aerial application services I would like to extend my apologies for the unpleasant noise and time of day that it occurs; we have implemented what practices we can to minimize the noise, although it may not be noticeably better. We would like to ask the public's understanding that are hours of operation are out of necessity relating to environmental factors and regulatory requirements, to achieve the desired outcomes and not thoughtlessness or ignorance.

Advertising in the Western Producer newspaper and other media for **direct buy** hail insurance may have aroused farmers' curiosity: two companies are now offering hail insurance at much reduced prices:

AG Direct Hail Insurance Ltd.

Prairie Municipal Hail Ltd.

AgDirect Hail advertises "No agents are required for these online companies, hence the lower prices." Farmers purchase their insurance directly, over the internet.

We decided to compare the 2014 rates with those of Saskatchewan Municipal Hail Insurance and found that in the R.M. of Chesterfield No. 261's twenty-five townships, only 2 *direct buy* township rates are lower than SMHI's by a substantial amount, one 15.5% and the other 49%, and there are only another 7 townships where the rate is slightly lower. The advertised savings, when compared to SMHI, don't exist.

This comparison does not take into account SMHI premiums are due August 31st or later, while direct buy requires payment at time of purchase. SMHI also insures the crop from time it sprouts out of the ground, even before crop reports are filed with the municipality the middle of June!

Saskatchewan Municipal Hail Insurance remains the *best value for the money!*

If you're interested in knowing which townships where direct buy will save you money, give us a call or an e-mail. We have a rate comparison showing all townships for the companies we represent, including rates for the two direct buy companies we don't.

Direct buy customers should consider Prairie Municipal Hail as the better direct buy option, as that company is a subsidiary of Saskatchewan Municipal Hail Insurance, while AG Direct is underwritten by Allianz Global Risks US Insurance Company.

Welcome to the 2014 Swimming Season! The pool is slated to open on June 16.

Swimming Lessons

Registrations are now available.

They can be picked up at the rec office or swimming pool, on the town website

www.eatonia.ca or contact the rec office at eatoniarec@yourlink.ca to have a form emailed.

All lessons times will be decided once registrations are in and instructors can plan according to numbers, everyone will be notified of their times once they've been decided. There are no lessons on weekends. Lessons take place in the mornings. We offer all levels of Red Cross swimming lessons in each set. If you are unsure in which level to register call the pool at 967-2401 or the rec office at 967-2557.

Important: To those attending swimming lessons please keep distractions at a minimum while lessons are in progress. Talking or boisterous play can distract the students from learning and make teaching more difficult. Absolutely no one is allowed in the pool other than those participating in lessons during their lesson times.

1st Set: June 30 – July 1

2nd Set: July 21 – Aug 1

3rd Set: Aug 11 - 15

4th Set: Aug 18 – 22

Set 3 & 4 can be taken as a 2-week set or you can chose to register for just one of the weeks. This must be decided at time of registration so instructors can plan accordingly.

Space is limited so register early. Register at the pool or rec office.

If you have taken lessons from a different provider then Red Cross just mark on the registration form the last level completed and the name of the provider (i.e.: Lifesaving Society, etc) and you will be placed in the appropriate Red Cross level.

Important Swimming Pool Info:

- Children 5 & under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian
- "Deep Ends"--Must have obtained Red Cross Swim Level 4 OR
- Be at least 6 years of age and capable of performing the following:
 - Swim four consecutive widths using an appropriate swimming stroke
 - Tread water for a minimum of 1 minute
 - At the Staff's discretion (if swimming ability is in question)
- To parents, guardians & caregivers: For the safety of yourself, your children & other patrons, we ask that you do not take small children or children without strong swimming abilities into the deep end.

Parents of Preschoolers:

You must stay within arm's reach of your children at all times.

Water wings, lifejackets and other floatation devices do not replace parental supervision.

Thank you for your co-operation.

These rules are for everyone's safety!

Discipline Policy:

- A strict discipline policy will be adhered to. Patrons failing to obey all pool rules or any abuse of lifeguards, staff or other patrons will result in the offender being removed from the pool.

Parent Water Safety

Why is Swimming Important?

- ~Swimming is a life-long sport
- ~Swimming promotes multi-generational interaction
- ~It's fun

How Can Parents Prevent Accidents?

- ~Enroll children in swim lessons
- ~Use CSA-approved life jackets
- ~Make sure children aged five and under are at least an arm's length away or less
- ~Continuously watch all of your children, no matter what age

Facts that Parents May Not Know

~Shallow water is the most common area for drowning, especially in water that is three feet deep or less

~Majority of drowning's occur to people who had no intention of entering the water

Remember

The lifeguard's duty is to prevent accidents from happening. They are responsible for the overall safety of the facility, you are responsible for your child's safety.

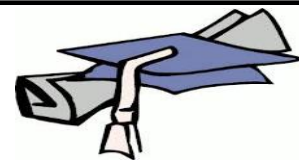

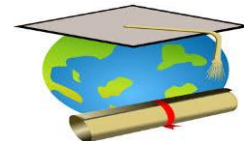

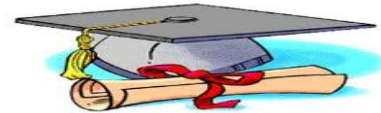

The following is an acknowledgement of donations since our last report in August 2013 to March 2014, the end of our fiscal year. Eatonia Oasis Living would be unable to operate without the financial support from surrounding towns and R.M.s and general donations from the public.

We received our grant of \$28,000.00 from the Kinsmen Telemiracle Foundation, and both our tubs have been replaced. There was \$5000.00 left over from the Esso Community Grant Fund received in 2009 that was also used towards this project. The tubs not only benefit the residents of Eatonia Oasis Living, but people in Eatonia and surrounding area who can access help from Home Care for bathing purposes.

The funding we received from the R.M. of Chesterfield was used to to purchase a new washer and dryer and to replace all of our beds. The new beds are electric, and meet all the standards and requirements of the Ministry of Health.

Our next projects include:

- Replacing the fire panel.
- Repairing/upgrading the control system for our boilers.
- Painting the interior of the facility.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support of our facility, financially and otherwise.
