
EATONIA YOGI'S

Arena: Arena Registration was September 8. If you missed registration please do so asap. If you need a form I can mail or email a registration package out.

There is a public skating /shinny pass for all residents that are not registered in the hockey or skating program but still use the arena for public skating or shinny, you will be required to have this pass.

Two deposit cheques of \$500 each per family are required for kitchen and caretaking responsibilities.

Payment is due by December 31, 2014. We accept post-dated cheques for Arena Registrations.

Automated External Defibrillator.

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm. If needed, it can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. AED's are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest (SCA).


SCA is a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. When this happens, blood stops flowing to the brain and other vital organs.

SCA usually causes death if it's not treated within minutes. In fact, each minute of SCA leads to a 10 percent reduction in survival. Using an AED on a person who is having SCA may save the person's life.

- 1) Community Hall
- 2) Arena/Pool
- 3) Fire Truck
- 4) Rover
- 5) Co-op Grocery Store
- 6) Co-op Lumber Yard




