Town of Eatonia News Cont'd Cats Litter - Dogs Bylaw No. 3/08

If a dog or cat defecates on any public property other than the property of the owner, possessor or harbourer of the said dog or cat, the owner, possessor or harbourer of the dog or cat shall cause such defecation to be removed immediately and disposed of in a sanitary fashion. Failure to cause such removal shall be an infraction of this Bylaw.

Penalty (fine) for first offence \$50.00.

Noise Bylaw

From the hours of 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. no noise is allowed that is loud/unusual or unnecessary and is persistent. There are people who work shift work, etc. and you should take consideration for this between 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.
PLAYING MUSIC, PETS, REVING OF ENGINES ETC.

Talking with your neighbor could save a lot of grief in the long run if you try to be considerate.

All-Terrain Vehicles (Quads, dirt bikes, etc.)

These vehicles are not allowed (The Highway Traffic Act) to be driven on any highway or within the town limits. To ride on private land, you need their permission in addition to the following rules given under The Highway Traffic Act. Any unregistered vehicle of any kind in contravention is subject to a fine of \$535.00 as well as the vehicle being seized. In addition, the operator can be fined under The Noise Bylaw.

Outdoor Storage of Materials ... Any building materials, lumber, scrap metal, boxes or similar items stored in a yard shall be neatly stacked in piles and elevated at least 0.15 meters off the ground so as not to constitute a nuisance or harborage for rodents, vermin and insects.



Observe the annual pruning ban. Do not prune your Elms between April 1st and August 31st.

The Elm Bark Beetle that spreads the DED fungus is attached to freshly cut elm and is most active during this period. Don't use, store, or transport Elm wood. It's illegal! One piece of elm firewood can carry over 1 800 infested elm bark beetles. The DED regulations apply to all Elms including Siberian & Manchurian Elms.

Swimming Pool

The pool is scheduled to be open on June 15 and depending on the number of swimming lesson registrants we may or may not be able open for public swimming in the evenings of June 15-19 & 22-26. We will have Public Swimming on June 20 & 21 from 1-5pm & 7-9pm. The regular swimming schedule will start on June 27.

Swimming Lessons

All lessons times are decided once registrations are in and instructors can plan according to numbers, everyone will be notified of their times once they've been decided (this can be a week to a few days in advance). There are no lessons on weekends. Lessons take place in the mornings with the exception of Set 1 which is after school. We offer all levels of Red Cross swimming lessons in each set.

If you are unsure in which level to register call the pool at 967-2401 or the rec office at 967-2557.

Important: To those attending swimming lessons please keep distractions at a minimum while lessons are in progress. Talking or other kids playing or running on the deck can distract the students from learning and make teaching more difficult. Absolutely no one is allowed in the pool other than those participating in lessons during their lesson times.

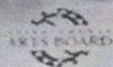
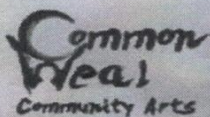
