
As a group, we would like to make a donation in Lenore Bailey's memory to be put towards a bridge in the Hall courtyard, in recognition of her dedication and commitment to community.

Eatonia Cemetery

The council is considering placing a columbarium at the Eatonia Cemetery if there is an interest for it. A columbarium is a vault with niches for urns. A columbarium can range in sizes from 16, 32, 48 or 64 niches. A family can purchase a niche and place up to 2 urns in it. The door on the niche would be engraved like a headstone.

Cat Repellant for <u>summer use</u>:

3 cloves Garlic 1 Tbsp. Cayenne Pepper 3 ounces Water

Mix in a blender until mixture looks like water. Use air atomizer to spray mist over forbidden area.





West Nile Virus

Warmer weather is here and it is important to protect yourself from mosquito bites. Not only are bites uncomfortable, but the mosquito that bites you may also give you West Nile virus. Although the chances of contracting West Nile virus are generally low, there are still risks. There are simple and effective measures you can take to reduce the risks.

The risk of being infected is the greatest during the warm summer months. In Canada, this can start as early as mid-April and last until the first hard frost in late September or October. The majority of people infected with West Nile virus has no symptoms and do not feel sick. Mild symptoms may include:

Fever, headache, body aches, mild rash, and swollen lymph glands

While anyone infected with West Nile virus can be at risk of developing more severe symptoms and health effects, such as meningitis and encephalitis, adults 50 years of age and older, and those with underlying conditions and/or weaker immune systems are at greater risk.

Symptoms of severe illness may include:

• Rapid onset of severe headache, high fever, stiff neck, nausea, difficulty swallowing, vomiting, drowsiness, confusion, loss of consciousness, lack of coordination, muscle weakness, and paralysis

Some patients with severe illness could experience a variety of health effects for many months to years after their initial illness.

There is no specific treatment or vaccine for West Nile virus. Serious cases are treated with supportive therapies (e.g., intravenous fluids, respiratory support and prevention of secondary infections) that may require hospital or nursing care.

You can protect yourself from mosquito bites and reduce your risk of contracting West Nile virus by following these simple measures:

- Use insect repellent that contains DEET-Icaridin or other approved ingredients
- Wear light-colored clothing, a long-sleeved shirt and long pants
- Make sure screen doors and windows are in good repair to keep mosquitos outside
- Empty standing water around your home and property

The campground revitalization project began in 2013 after winning \$4000.00 from the Prairie Centre Community Project Contest. Since then we have upgraded the 8 original sites with water, sewer and power, we have installed a new transformer, so that we are able to have power and water to the 12 new sites that are in the process of being built, we have gravelled the original sites and will gravel the new sites once they are complete. We are also planning on re-planting established trees, planting grass, building a new shower/washroom, building a new sewer dump, installing a communal fire pit and installing an area light.

We have raised \$28,205.77 from the Kramer Consignment Auction lunch which is our major fundraiser.

Our costs, so far, have been \$31,159.38 and we estimate that it will still cost approximately \$85,000 to finish this project.


