November Rec News

Arena:

The Arena has been busy getting ready for the winter season! Community clean-up was held on Tuesday, October 11th and I would like to thank all those who showed up to help out. The turnout was great and the cleaning was finished up in no time!

The ice making process started on Monday, October 17th with plant start up. The following days were very busy getting hose floods and painting done. A huge thanks to Matt Hoffman and Mitch Larock for all the time they put in at the Arena getting things organized to get the ice made. Thank you also goes out to the many volunteers that showed up to help with the hose floods and painting, it wouldn't get done without your help!

The caretaker sign-up sheet is up on the bulletin board and I have also posted available kitchen shifts on the kitchen door for all those who need to sign up. My plan is to post 4-6 weeks of kitchen shifts at a time. I also put a sign-up sheet on the kitchen door for anyone 14 years and older who would be interested in being hired by a Minor Hockey or Skating Club parent to work in the kitchen.

Eatonia Minor Hockey hosted a Power Skating Camp on the weekend of October 29-30. The camp was offered free of charge to all Minor Hockey players in Eatonia and Leader. Kristin and BJ Somerville ran the camp and they had a great turnout!

The Recreation Board is offering public skating and shinny passes at the rate of \$25/family. We would like to see as many families as possible using the Arena and thought this would be a great way to make that happen. Please stop by the rec office to purchase your pass! Please take note that all hockey player and skating club member fees already include a pass for shinny and public skating.

The ice schedule is posted at the Arena and will be updated every couple of weeks. Please keep in mind that the schedule is subject to change and that games and ice rental may replace public skating and shinny times if needed.

Keep your eyes open for posters of upcoming Minor Hockey games and Senior Huskies games!

Co-ed Rec Volleyball:

We are going to start Co-ed Rec Volleyball! You can register as a team or as an individual (and we'll get you on a team) by calling or texting me at 460-7130. If we have enough teams we will go ahead with playing the teams against each other. If there is not enough team interest, we will still go ahead with volleyball but will all meet at the gym and make teams with who shows up. We are planning this for Sunday evenings to avoid conflict with the gym schedule and as many children's activities as possible. It would be nice to start mid-late November so please get registered as soon as possible!

Payment Policy:

The Eatonia and District Recreation Board has passed a new policy regarding payment for activities.

All Hockey/Skating fees must be paid in full by December 31st of that year. Two deposit cheques of \$500 to cover your kitchen shifts and caretaking duties must be included with your payment and be dated no later than December 31st of that year (these are only cashed if your kitchen shifts and/or caretaking shifts are not fulfilled by the end of the season).

Swimming lessons must be paid in full the first day of lessons. Swimming fees must be paid in full by August 31st of that year. Punch cards must be paid in full at time of purchase.
