MAYOR'S MESSAGE

DECEMBER 2017

Greetings,

November has come and gone and while not as eventful, thankfully, as October things continued to happen. At the time of this writing we have not yet had the public meeting that was held on November 29th, but I'm sure it went well with a good turnout.

We are entering the later part of the year and will be reviewing our budget for 2018, and while I can't be certain, I don't expect quite as much for capital expenditures; at least planned expenditures.

Speaking of planned expenditures, we've had a few unplanned capital expenses through the year and heading into 2018, most recently some issues with roof leaking at the arena. We are looking at a proper fix which could cost north of \$50,000 which we are looking to work with other stakeholders to complete that project.

Another hot topic at council has been waste and how we can protect the nuisance grounds and keep that a viable asset for many years into the future. We are implementing a bi-weekly curbside recycling program, we hope you utilize it and help divert some of the unnecessary waste. Other potential parts of a solution include tipping fees, weekly bin limits, and closing the open garbage truck; details to be finalized.

Do you ever wonder what council does or is supposed to do? Exert from www.saskatchewan.ca:

Council's responsibility is to make decisions about municipal services, establish policies and provide direction for the operation of the municipality in a manner which encourages participation in the governance process.

While every council is a little different, we are largely a governance board as opposed to operational but do retain some minor operational components. This means rather than being involved in the daily operations we provide the direction and oversight to administration. Our council consists of one mayor and six councillors, all which have an equal vote and voice; the mayor chairs the meetings and has few additional authorities.

It has now been a year since council undertook our current 4 year term. As a newcomer, I had some expectations but there were many things I did not expect; it has been an interesting 12 months and I look forward to the remaining 36.

I hope to see you all out and about through December as there are many local events happening (See upcoming events listed elsewhere in the newsletter.





CURBSIDE RECYCLING

The Town of Eatonia has entered into an agreement with Triways Disposal Services to provide curbside recycle collection to residential residents.

Triways will be dropping off a 95 gallon residential rolling blue cart around the middle of December. The carts will be emptied bi-weekly every second Thursday. The first pickup date will be January 4, 2018. Triways will send the town a yearly schedule that shows pickup days for recycle collection which will be distributed to households and provided on the eatonia webpage.

The recycling service is single stream – a system where all recycle materials, including cardboard, paper, plastics, tin and aluminum products, are placed unsorted in the blue recycle cart. Triways will provide brochures for each residence explaining the program in more detail which will be mailed out with the next utility billing or can be picked up at the town office.

Acceptable Recyclables:

- Paper Products including cardboard, magazines, newspaper, office paper and assorted paper products
- Tin/Metal/Aluminum/Steel (rinsed) including soup cans, beverage containers, vegetable cans, etc.
- Plastic Containers (rinsed):
