## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

NOVEMBER 2017

Well October is in the books and what an October it was! The grass fires of October 17<sup>th</sup>, and days following, were something else and council send their best wishes to all of those affected by the events of that day and the days following.

A big thank-you to our C.E.N. Firefighters, other departments in the areas, and all those who were out there hauling water, running equipment, or doing whatever you could to help. I'd also like to extend a thank you to Lance Buddecke, Vanessa Price, Neil Specht, Duane Becker, and Del Price who helped the town in our preparations as events unfolded. Thank you to our town and RM of Chesterfield staff and councils. Frankly, thank you to EVERYONE! It was nice to see people come together in a time of need.

Administration has been working on updating our Emergency Response Plan (ERP), ironically they had a meeting the morning of the fires, and with the current events we have some revisions/additions. We are looking at how we can better communicate with our residents to ensure they are getting accurate and reliable information in a timely manner. Please ensure Town Office has a current phone number on file. If you are willing to volunteer for a role in a situation where we may activate the ERP (For example, go door-to-door for an evacuation notice), please advise the town office so we can add you to the list. We also realize that our ERP needs to accommodate all situations and we must not get too focused on the current events but learn from what did and could have happened.

Please mark Wednesday, November 29<sup>th</sup> on your calendar as we will be holding an open town meeting; council has just passed the 1 year mark. Do you have something you'd like to discuss at an open forum? Some topics I have in mind; Property Taxes, Roads & Sidewalks, Emergency Response Plan, Waste & Recycling, Town Operating & Capital Budget. I can't guarantee that we'll have all the answers, but if you let me know before the meeting we can be more prepared specifically on that topic to help make constructive use of everyone's time.

Please note the changes to garbage pick-up in November as garbage will be collected from the front/roads during the winter months.

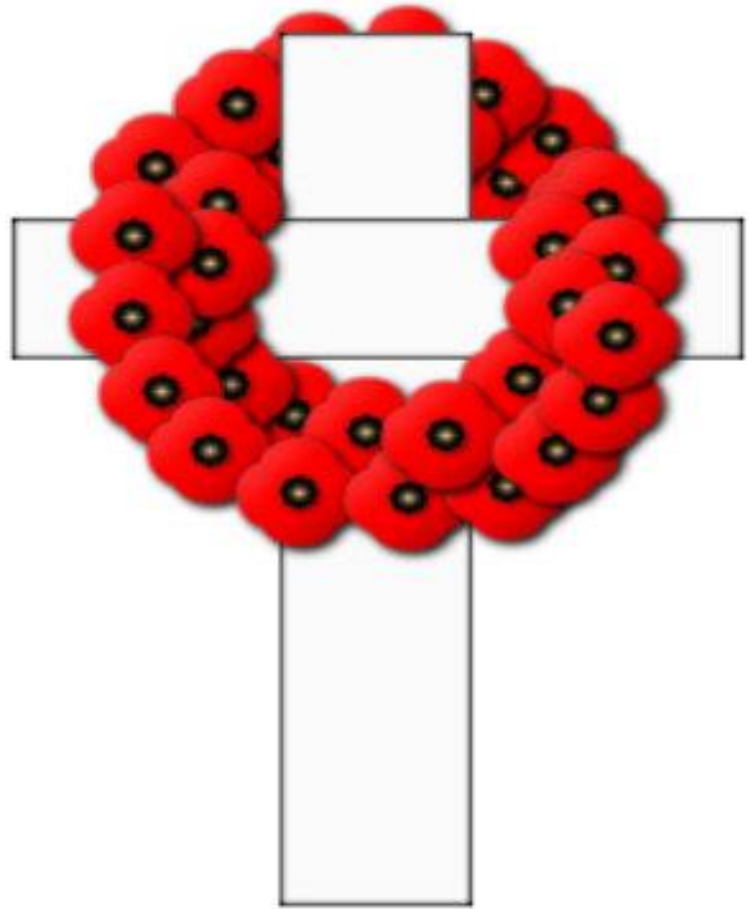

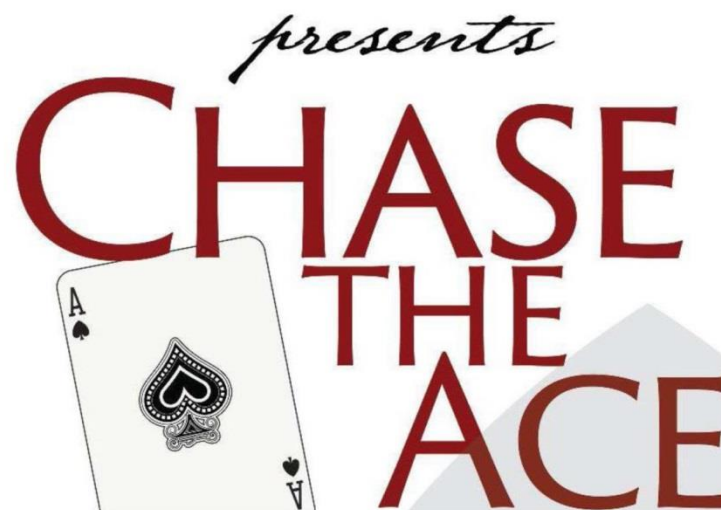

## November Rec News

### **Arena:**

The Arena has been busy getting ready for the winter season! Community clean-up was held on Thursday, October 5th and I would like to thank all those who showed up to help out. Special mention goes out to the Junior and Senior football teams for all the work they did to help out with clean up, it was great to have so many of you there!

The ice making process started on Tuesday, October 12<sup>th</sup> with plant start up. The following days were very busy getting hose floods and painting done. A huge thanks to Matt Hoffman and Mitch Larock for all the time they put in at the Arena getting things organized to get the ice made. Thank you also goes out to the many volunteers that showed up to help with the hose floods and painting, it wouldn't get done without your help!

The caretaker sign-up sheet is up on the bulletin board. Please remember when you are caretaking to fill out the check in/out sheet located in the janitor closet in the white binder.

The available kitchen shifts for October through December are posted on the kitchen door. My plan is to post a couple months of kitchen shifts at time. The Kitchen Committee decided that all youth 14-17 who would like to work in the kitchen must take a mandatory training session. These sessions are being offered on Monday, October 30<sup>th</sup> at 4pm and Thursday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7pm. Only students with the training will be allowed to be hired for work or be able to work for their families. I will post a list of available students once the training is completed. Also, any new parents that would like to take the training to learn what to do in the kitchen are more than welcome to sign up.

The arena kitchen area has gotten a facelift over the past few months thanks to the Community Initiative Fund Spaces and Places Grant. This grant was offered with 50/50 cost sharing. Thanks to the Town of Eatonia, Arena Kitchen Committee and the Recreation Board the kitchen area received all new paint, all new appliances and new lights. We also ended up replacing some countertops due to water damage. We were also able

to purchase all new tables for the area with generous donations from Eatonia Lions Club, Huskies Hockey Club, Eatonia Minor Hockey and the Arena Kitchen Committee.

The Eatonia Minor Hockey hosted a Power Skating Camp on the weekend of October 28-30. The camp was offered free of charge to all Minor Hockey players in Eatonia and Leader. The turnout was once again fantastic. Huge thanks to Kristin and BJ Somerville for running this Power Skating Camp.

The Recreation Board is offering public skating and shinny passes at the rate of \$25/family. We would like to see as many families as possible using the Arena and thought this would be a great way to make that happen. Please stop by the rec office to purchase your pass! Please take note that all hockey player and skating club member fees already include a pass for shinny and public skating. All others including family members, general public, Huskies and Wheat Kings require a pass to use the ice for shinny or public skating. We did have trouble last year with people regularly using the ice without a pass so this year I will provide one warning when there is a violation and then I will start posting names on the arena bulletin board. The cost of a pass is extremely reasonable and we would appreciate everyone's cooperation with this.

The ice schedule is posted at the Arena and will be updated every couple of weeks. Please keep in mind that the schedule is subject to change and that games and ice rental may replace public skating and shinny times if needed.

### **Co-ed Rec Volleyball:**

Co-ed Rec Volleyball will be starting in the next couple of weeks and will be on Sunday evenings. This year we are offering Youth Rec Volleyball for ages 12-16 from 6:30-7:30pm and ages 17-adult will be on from 7:30-9:30pm. This program is offered entirely for recreation purposes so ALL ABILITY LEVELS are welcome to join in the fun. Please watch for posters and updates on the Eatonia and District Recreation facebook page for a starting date. This program is offered free of charge.

**Zumba:**

Zumba has unfortunately been on hold this past few weeks to our instructor having an injury. We will pick up the last two weeks of Zumba once she is ready to go. After Zumba wraps up we will start a new 6-week session that includes a half hour of cardio and a half hour of weight training. Please keep your eyes open for more information and registration on our next 6-week session!

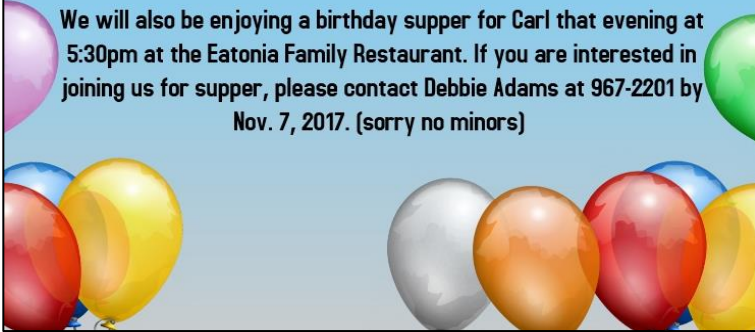
