MAYOR'S MESSAGE

FEBRUARY 2018

Another month come and gone, time sure seems to be flying by. Administration is closing up another year and we are preparing our budget for 2018, which is sure to be challenging but not quite like 2017.

A reminder for all business owners to renew their annual business licenses for 2018. If you are planning a home renovation and have hired a contractor from out of town, they required to purchase a business license. As the homeowner you are responsible to ensure they have a business license; if not the cost can be added to your property taxes.

I would like to thank Teana Hayes for her years of service on the Eatonia Recreation Board.

At our January council meeting, we made a few changes to council's committee appointments. An updated list is available at the town office. There are some vacancies on committees, including the Eatonia Housing Authority and Recreation Board, among others. If sitting on a board isn't your thing, we could always use volunteers for all kinds of events and activities throughout the year.

The town has several capital items we are looking to undertake, a few others in consideration, and likely some unexpected surprises along the way. The town typically has between \$150,000 to \$200,000 annually in which can be used towards such projects and has relied on grants for major projects in the past. When you consider the towns responsibility includes water, sewer, roads, nuisance grounds, various equipment's, and many buildings that \$200,000 goes rather quickly.

Thank you to those who were quick to adopt the blue recycle bins. The permit for the nuisance grounds is up in 2019, and it is our mission to reduce the amount of waste going out there. We have already begun to see a reduction in waste and hope to see that trend continue. We do encourage all residents to use their recycle bins to their full potential in order to help prevent increased rates for disposal services, or even the loss of our nuisance grounds. We ask that you please move the bins closer to your home and off the boulevard/street when not being picked-up and ensure only approved recyclables are collected. You do NOT need to sort or bag most items. I recently learnt that Pizza Boxes are NOT approved as the oil soils the cardboard.

The town is also going to be closing the garbage truck parked behind the fitness centre. Sorry if this may cause an inconvenience but we are doing this to help encourage residents to participate in the new recycling program.

We continue to have discussions with RCMP regarding their presence in and around town. If you see something worth reporting, please report it to the RCMP so that it can be counted in their stats. These stats are important in determining policing levels.

Regular garbage pick-up will resume every Monday morning at 8:00 a.m.

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2018

there has been a rate increase to garbage pickup and recycling fees. You will notice this increase on your next utility bill which will be mailed out on March 1, 2018.

The rate increases are as follows (per billing):

Minimum Water Fee \$87.20

Overage Rate \$8.10/1000 gallons

Sewer Fee \$19.36

Waste Collection Fee \$29.28

Recycling Fee \$10.00

RECYCLING BINS NORTH OF TOWN SHOP

The big blue recycling bins located north of the Town's shop will remain in use for Town and Rural residents. We highly encourage all rural residents to use these as the Nuisance Grounds permit is up in 2019 and we are trying to limit the amount of garbage that is going out there. Paper/Tin/Shredded Paper must be separated and bagged in clear plastic bags. Paper and Cardboard can be thrown in loose. Feel free to contact the Town Office if you have any questions.

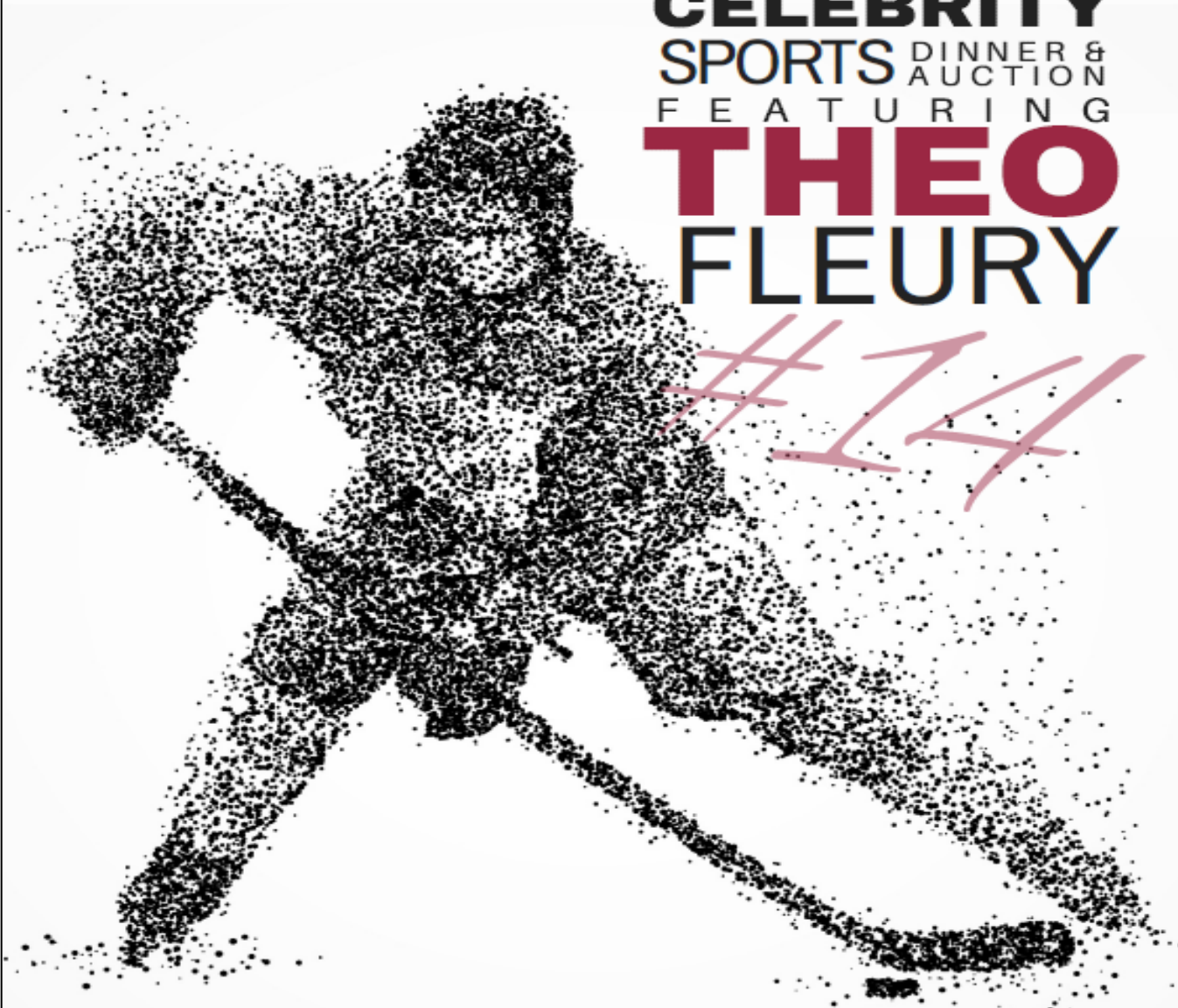
