

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

The Town of Eatonia has entered into an agreement with Triways Disposal Services to provide curbside recycle collection to residential residents.

The recycling service is a single stream – a system where a recyclable materials, including cardboard, paper, plastics, tins and aluminum products, are placed unsorted in the blue recycle cart. A brochure will be mailed out with the next utility billing for your reference.

All residents are encouraged to remove all recyclables from their waste stream and deposit them in their cart.

Each cart provided to a residence shall be for the sole use of the owner or occupant of the residence; and carts shall not be removed from the residence by the owner or occupant, or used for any other purpose other than as permitted. The carts must remain and are registered to the said property, regardless of transfer of ownership of the property. If a cart is damaged due to negligence, lost and/or stolen it is considered the owner or occupant's responsibility and could potentially result in you purchasing the cart in this matter.


Unless otherwise instructed by the Town, users shall place carts on the street in front of their property with the cart wheels facing the curb allowing at least three (3) feet on all sides of the container.

Carts must be placed for collections no later than 7 a.m. on scheduled collection day and no earlier than 6 p.m. the day prior to collection. Carts must not remain on the street longer than 12 hours after scheduled collection.

Carts may not be emptied if:

- a) Contents of the cart are too heavy;
- b) The cart contains non-recyclable materials;
- c) The cart is over-filled so that the lid does not close;
- d) The cart is not accessible by the truck, due to improper placement next to vehicles, snow banks or other obstacles; and
- e) The cart was not placed at the curb by the appropriate time.

An annual pick-up schedule and a list of acceptable materials will be mailed out with your utility notice. They can also be found on our website at <u>www.eatonia.ca</u>.
