## NOTICE TO BUSINESSES & RESIDENTS 2018 SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT PROJECT

This summer the Town of Eatonia will be replacing sidewalks on Main Street between Highway 44 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. The Town has hired a contractor (Huseini Concrete & Paving Ltd) to replace the sidewalk on both sides of Main Street.

### Proposed Work

This work includes the following:

- Remove existing sidewalks;
- Install new concrete sidewalks;
- Install new curb and gutter;
- Install wheel chair access ramps;
- Construct concrete slabs in front of the Town Office and in front of the Fitness Centre;
- Asphalt patching.

### What to Expect During Construction

- There might be temporary short-term closure of roadways to facilitate construction
- Some noise from construction equipment
- Access will be provided at all times

### Opportunity for Businesses

This is an opportunity for businesses to improve access to their businesses. The contractor can replace or install concrete access or install a depressed access to businesses, where practical. **The improvements will be paid for by those businesses making the request.** Businesses wishing to improve access to their properties are asked to contact the Town Administrator to obtain an estimate.

### Schedule

The construction will take place between July and September and take 3 weeks to complete, weather permitting.

**R.M. of Chesterfield No. 261 wants to notify the ratepayers of the following**

In Bylaw 2/79, farmers and ranchers are reminded that cultivation offences will carry penalties as set out in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Municipality. Cultivating and spraying road allowances destroys grass which is necessary to preserve the road. The municipality will have to re-plant grass in areas where it has been destroyed, and the cost of doing so will be charged to the abutting landowners. The grass takes about one (1) year to become established; so there will be weeds during the establishment period. Once grass is growing, the road shoulder will be preserved, and the life of the road will be lengthened.

- Anyone we may have inadvertently missed – Thank you!

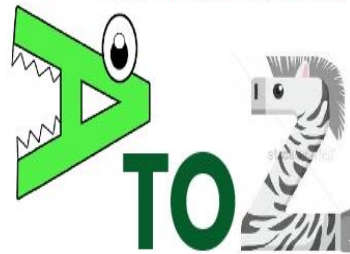

## UPDATE ON EATONIA CEMETERY

A big thank you is in order to the "bee" workers on Monday, June 25. The group handily demonstrated efficiency!

Improvement projects initiated by the Cemetery Committee are underway.

The Manchurian elm trees have been removed in preparation for replacement with Colorado spruce trees in 2019.

The building of the highway last year left the ditch on the front of the cemetery in a condition unacceptable for maintenance. The Dept. of Highways will try to improve it but removal of the black iron fence was necessary for the reconstruction. The fence will be replaced but its design is dependent on the contouring of the completed ditch.

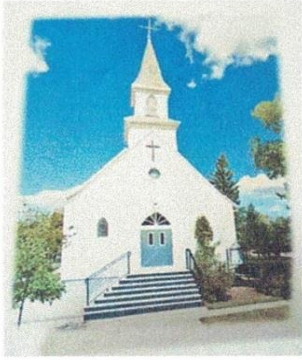
The property has been surveyed by Meridian Surveys Ltd. The discovery of a SaskTel cable crossing the new section was not good news. Negotiations were conducted to relocate it. Low lying surface areas were marked to be built up.

Ornamentation not attached to a monument (flowers, wreaths, glassware, plaques) which hinders maintenance is not permitted as outlined in the town cemetery bylaw. At the present time the quantity of these items in the cemetery is a problem for the caretaker. The public's cooperation in improving the situation with removal of the items is requested. A solar light may be placed on a side of a monument. A better alternative for flowers and lights is the purchase of a permanent vase to be fixed on the side of the monument.

Grave covers, as well, are not allowed. Families will be contacted as plans for removal of concrete and fibreglass covers are in the discussion stage.

The Cemetery Committee is a committee of the Town of Eatonia. The mayor, administrator and one councillor are members. To date it is funded by donations. Persons wishing to participate in beautifying the final resting place of their loved ones may do so with the appreciation of the committee. Cheques addressed to Town of Eatonia, Cemetery Committee will receive a tax receipt from the town administrator.

A statement from the Family and Friends Community Foundation in Langenburg reads as follows: *The measure of a community's respect for those who have gone before is the care it provides to its cemeteries.* Something to think about - for communities everywhere!
