#### MAYOR'S MESSAGE

March is here, and the days are finally starting to get noticeably longer. It was a short month one with holidays for many, myself included, but it's been busy as usual around town.

Over the past couple of years many defibrillators have been purchased within town, some by the local businesses which house them. Please note their locations at the Co-op service station and grocery store, Arena/Pool (relocated seasonally), Prairie Centre Credit Union lobby, E.O.L., Somerville Farms, the community hall, and one of the fire trucks. The only location that is accessible 24/7 is at Prairie Centre Credit Union.

The Park Committee is looking for new members to join the board to meet 1 to 2 times a year to ensure upkeep and improvements to our local parks (Centennial & Melville). Please inquire at the Town Office for additional details about this or any other local committee that may be of interest to you.

A couple of items related to our water. We will be asking residents who still have the older meters (2/3rds of homes) to submit their own water readings from now on. A notice will be sent out in the newsletter and phone calls will be made when we require your next reading. You also may have noticed more turbidity (particles in the water) recently, there are no concerns but will be addressed with through new filter media and possibly a cleaning of the holding tank.

March is budget time for town council and we will determine what property tax mill rates will look like for 2018. I would love any feedback about the town's finances as capital projects have and continue to be a challenge as we decide the best ways to use our limited capital funds.

My specific question for the month is related to town donations. In the past the town has donated funds to various local events (less than \$1,000 annually) to things such as, but not limited to, the Sportsman Dinner, Bullarama, and the Tradeshow. Is it appropriate for the town to use tax payer money to support these events or leave it to community to support how they see fit?



## **FALSE ALARMS**

In the past few years the Eatonia Fire Brigade has had numerous call-outs that were false alarms. This could be from various different situations, such as, low batteries in your smoke detectors or carbon monoxide monitors, toasters, or even the self-clean feature on your ovens, etc. Every time your alarm system sends out a false alarm the Fire Brigade will get dispatched in which they MUST respond to. In an attempt to minimize the amount of false alarms we receive we are asking homeowners to know their alarm system and passwords in order to cancel the call-out. Also, please take a few minutes to check and replace the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide monitors, and continue to do this on a regular basis.
