MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Bring on May and some warmer temperatures. It's time to put the shovels away! Get out your lawn mower.

Please remember the town watering bylaw, if you are seeding new grass and need additional water times please contact the town office. As well, even numbered houses can water on even calendar days and odd numbered houses can water on odd calendar days. You can water between the hours of 7:00 and 10:00 morning and evenings on your assigned days.

The Sportsman Dinner was held in April and sounds like it was a big success once again. A job well done by all of those involved, thank you for making it happen!

Thank you to Amanda Longmuir for her term as President on the Recreation board and congratulations to Spencer Somerville who was elected by acclamation as President at their recent AGM.

By now you should have received a notice regarding property tax increase for 2018. Residential mill rate was raised 3 percent while the minimum tax was raised by 5 percent.

Total budgeted revenue for 2018 is \$1,373,000. This amount includes different boards, such as the Recreation and the Heritage boards, budgeted revenue. Property taxes generate \$418,000, grants \$494,000, services \$280,000, and fundraised/donations \$181,000.

We have over \$400,000 in capital projects, including finishing a small section of water main from the wells, sidewalks on Main Street, some curbing, and paving.

NOTIFICATION TO CONSUMERS

In accordance with Section 44 of the Water Regulations, 2002, the Town hereby notifies consumers that the information on the quality of water supplied to the residents and compliance to sample submission requirements is available for viewing at the Town Office during regular office hours or can be viewed on the Town's Webpage at www.eatonia.ca

As per the Animal Control Bylaw No. 6/15
All Dogs and Cats over four (4) months old must obtain a pet license from the Town Office no later than February 1st. If you haven't registered your pet yet please do so as soon as possible or further action will be initiated.

As per the bylaw no household should have more than two (2) cats and two (2) dogs over the age of 4 months.

Management's Responsibility

Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accompanying financial statements, including responsibility for significant accounting judgments and estimates in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles and ensuring that all information in the annual report is consistent with the statements. This responsibility includes selecting appropriate accounting principles and methods, and making decisions affecting the measurement of transactions in which objective judgment is required.

In discharging its responsibilities for the integrity and fairness of the financial statements, management designs and maintains the necessary accounting systems and related internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that transactions are authorized, assets are safeguarded and financial records are properly maintained to provide reliable information for the preparation of financial statements.

The Council is composed of elected officials who are not employees of the Municipality. The Council is responsible for overseeing management in the performance of its financial reporting responsibilities. The Council fulfils these responsibilities by reviewing the financial information prepared by the administration and discussing relevant matters with external auditors. The Council is also responsible for recommending the appointment of the Municipality's external auditors.

Close Hauta Bertoia Blanchette, an independent firm of Chartered Professional Accountants, is appointed by the Council to audit the financial statements and report directly to them; their report follows. The external auditors have full and free access to, and meet periodically and separately with, both the Council and administration to discuss their audit findings.
