A by-election will be held this fall to fill the vacancy. Nomination forms are available at the Town Office for those eligible and interested in running for the position. Deputy Mayor Troy Becker will be filling the vacancy until a new Mayor has been elected.

Summer is nearly over and the students will be heading back to the classrooms on September 4th. Please watch for students as they are walking or biking to and from school.

Thank you to our summer students Garrett King and Hannah Eckstein for all their hard work this year. Hannah will be finished work on August 31st to head back to school and Garret will continue working into the fall yet to help finish up some fall work.

The pool will be closing on Monday, September 3rd with a dog swim from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. The last day for the playground program is Thursday, August 30th. Thank you to all the lifeguards and playground program workers for an excellent job done. It is hard to believe that the summer is over and the ice will be going in soon.

Work is continuing on the arena roof and rebuilding the Zamboni room.

The sidewalks on Main Street are tentatively scheduled to be replaced around September 15th and will take approximately 3 weeks to complete, weather permitting. There might be a temporary short term closure of roadways to facilitate construction but access to businesses will continue to be available during their business hours. The sidewalks are being replaced with funds from the Federal Gas Tax Grant.

**Display Devices**

Televisions and monitors, including various technologies such as Cathode Ray Tube (CRT), flat panel (LCD, LED and plasma) and rear projection.

**Non-Cellular Telephones**

Includes corded and cordless telephones, as well as telephone answering machines.

**Home Audio/Video Systems**

Includes VCRs, DVD and CD players, digital cable and satellite equipment, speakers, amplifiers, receivers, data projectors and similar audio/video systems.

**Desktop Computers**

Desktop computers (including those acting as servers) and all bundled keyboards, mice, cables and internal components.

**Portable Computers**

Includes portable computers such as laptops, netbooks, notebooks and tablets.

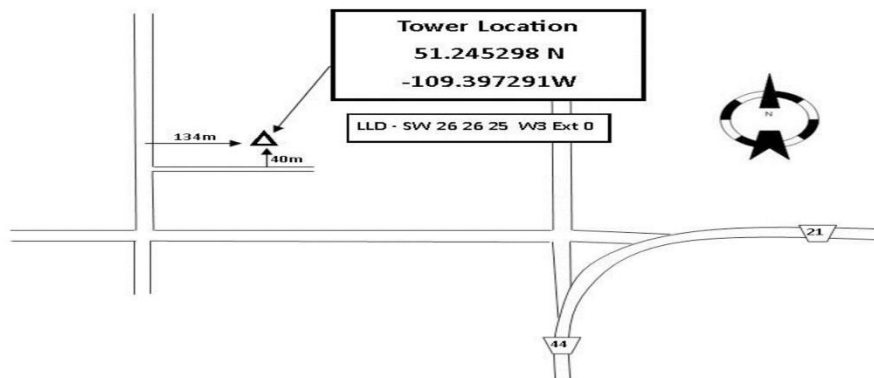

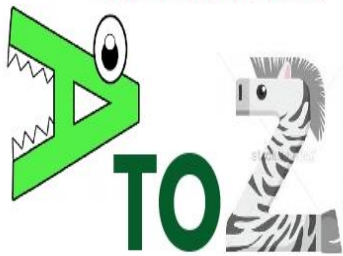
