### ANNUAL WATERWORKS INFORMATION

### WATERWORKS RATE POLICY:

The water and sewer rates that are established for the next six (6) years were chosen to be an acceptable rate for residents and businesses. Water and sewer operating expenditures include waterworks' staff salaries, benefits and training; power, heat; insurance; chemicals; repairs; maintenance; supplies; etc.

Below provides the planned water and sewer rate increases of 10 percent every second year over the next six years. To demonstrate the impact, below are estimated monthly charges that reflect the rate increases on the base residential and business rates:

Council will work towards water and sewer work revenues that cover water and sewer works expenditures. Council will closely monitor expenditures and review the rates on an annual basis.

By planning the water and sewer rate increases ahead of time, residents and businesses will be able to prepare for and adjust to increases. Bylaws will be passed every second year to increase water and sewer rates or sooner if needed.

### ANNUAL WATERWORKS INFORMATION TOWN OF EATONIA

The objective of the waterworks rate policy is to work towards waterworks that are self-financing, where the users pay for the costs of the service. To accomplish this, the rates need to increase over time so that the revenues cover operating costs, to the extent possible. At the end of every year of the planned rate increases, Council will review its policy to determine if revenues are covering costs. At that time, Council will also need to consider increasing rates to build the reserves in order to cover future infrastructure maintenance and replacement costs.

This water and sewer works rate policy will works towards financially independent water and sewer works that do not have to compete with other key municipal financial demands under the municipal general revenue fund. This will ensure our waterworks can provide safe drinking water. Also, rates that cover costs will influence consumer demand and water conservation, and self-financing utility works will reduce pressures on property taxes.

### **CURRENT WATER AND SEWER RATES:**

On September 12, 2017, Council passed Bylaw No. 4/17 to fix the rates to be charged for the provision of water and sewer services:

### WATERWORKS CAPITAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY:

The objective of the waterworks capital investment strategy is to address anticipated waterworks infrastructure maintenance and future infrastructure replacements in a timely fashion so as to ensure the municipal waterworks provides safe drinking water and that wastewater is managed responsibly for residents and businesses. The strategy uses the waterworks system assessment that was required by Saskatchewan Environment for infrastructure planning.

To cover the costs of future waterworks infrastructure maintenance and replacements, Council will need to undertake, in the future, a combination of increasing water and sewer rates to build the utility reserves and if needed long term borrowing.

This capital investment strategy will ensure that safe drinking water can be provided to the residents and businesses in the community in the present and future.

Replacing the main water supply line that goes from the wells to the water treatment plant was started in August, 2017 and the project was completed on December 13, 2018. The total cost of the project was \$559,279.91. This project was approved for funding under the Clean Water and Wastewater Fund (CWWF). The federal government funded 50%, the province funded 25% and the town funded the remaining share of 25%. The town funded their portion with a combination of the utility reserve and the capital trust fund which are invested in a savings account and from the operating fund. The proposed increases are to rebuild the reserves that were used for this project in order to cover future infrastructure maintenance and replacement costs.

### WATERWORKS ASSESSMENT:

The Round 3 Waterworks System Assessment required by the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency was completed on December 22, 2015 by Pinter & Associates Ltd. On January 5, 2016, Rodney Lemon, Environmental Project Officer deemed the assessment for the town complete and met the requirements of the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency Standard. The Waterworks System Assessment is available at the municipal office.

### **CAPITAL PLANS:**

There are no capital plans for infrastructure projects right now.

### AGREEMENTS:

There are no agreements entered into respecting the provision of municipal waterworks services.

Council passed a resolution to accept this annual waterworks information on July 9, 2019.

### **Remembering Our History**

The community of Eatonia is gearing up for a festive celebration for the town's centennial. Ideas and visions are becoming plans in action for Year 2020!

Look back to 1920 – the reason for the celebration. People with ideas and visions were putting plans into action to build a community into a town called Eaton.

Stories of the 1900's from family memoirs are recorded in the <u>Past To Cherish</u> books. While entertaining to read, they tell of extreme obstacles and hardships. So many succumbed; many, including young children and babies died. The cemetery was registered in 1919 as families did their best to preserve the memory of those they buried there. But 100 years of Saskatchewan weather plus the orange lichen plant have deteriorated cement inscriptions rendering them unreadable.

To quote from the book, "*To pioneers such as these, their descendants owe a debt of eternal gratitude.*" Grandparents, great grandparents, those "good old guys" and "really nice people" who built the town – let's not let their memorials be lost. Families are encouraged to take a look and put a plan in place to honour their heritage. Kudos to those who have already invested in renewing their monuments.

The ongoing removal of concrete and fibreglass grave covers is a plan of action. The vision.... those grave sites repaired with grass seeded before summer 2020. Families will continue to be contacted for this project. However, individuals, after discussing plans with Town Office, may take their own initiative for cover removal and site repair. Those who have previously committed to upgrade their family plots are asked to complete the task as soon as possible this year.

Granite and marble covers may remain in place, but it is important to note many require maintenance due to tipping and sinking. This work is solely the family's responsibility.
