COUNCIL'S MESSAGE

Here we are, quickly approaching the end of the year!

We have recently hosted our annual public meeting, which was held on Thursday, November 21. We always encourage residents of town to attend this meeting as it gives them an opportunity to ask the council questions and provide feedback on concerns they may have. Thank you to all those that were able to attend.

One of the questions from the meeting was where does the money go for a fire call. Any money paid for a fire call goes to C.E.N. Fire Protection Association to cover costs to service the equipment, make necessary repairs, supply engine fuel, lubricants and any other supplies required to keep the equipment in operating condition; prorated share for power, energy and insurance for the fire hall; and wages to members of the Eatonia Fire Brigade for operating the truck and equipment in answer to calls and otherwise assisting in fighting fires originating from the area.

Another questions was how can residents be made aware of issues that the RCMP are dealing with. People can subscribe to the Sask Crime Watch Advisory Network, www.saskcrimewatch.ca. It is very easy for people to subscribe too and receive police safety alerts and requests for assistance from the RCMP. It only takes a few minutes to sign up.

With December comes the Old Fashioned Christmas put on by the Eatonia & District Chamber of Commerce which is held on Saturday, December 14, 2019. Bring your family for a visit and photos with Santa. Kids can shop at Santa's Shop for their family. Lots of activities planned that day for everyone to enjoy.

On September 10, 2019, the council of the Town of Eatonia passed the Protective Services Cost Recovery Bylaw No. 2/19 where the cost of fire prevention, suppression and emergency response services will be charged to the property owner who receives the service. This means that residents will be responsible for paying their own fire protection services. This will come into effect on January 1, 2020.

The Town of Eatonia, R.M. of Chesterfield No. 261 and R.M. of Newcombe No. 260 established a fire protection district which is known as the CEN Fire Protection Association. This association provides fire protection services to all residents within the boundaries.

Below is a breakdown of the fees they charge for fire protection services:

If the fire department is dispatched for a false alarm, the property owner will be charged a fee as per the rates set out above. A false alarm is any incident in which fire personnel are paged or respond to a fire alarm system or security alarm system that is activated by mistake or as a result of a malfunction. Make sure to check your fire or security alarm system on a regular basis to avoid a false alarm.

Make sure to check with your insurance broker to make sure that you have coverage for fire protection services in your policy.

JUST A REMINDER....

As of January 1, 2020, the residents of the Town of Eatonia, as per Bylaw No. 2/19, will be responsible for paying their own Fire Protection Services.

If you have a home/tenant/condo policy with **Wawanesa**, you automatically have \$10,000 coverage for Fire Protection Services built into your policy. Higher limits are available at cost of \$10.00/\$1000. **Please be advised that coverage will only apply to a "fire" loss – not "false" alarms.**

If you have a home/tenant/condo policy with **SGI CANADA**, you will have to buy this coverage separately. The cost is \$20.00 for the first \$5,000.00 of coverage and \$10.00/\$1000 for higher limits. **Please be advised that coverage will only apply to a "fire" loss – not "false" alarms.**

If it's cold and snowy, it's Playoff Football time! This was the case on Saturday, November 9th when the 1A 6-Man championship game featured the Kerrobert Rebels and the Eaton School Spartans in a battle for the Provincial title.

The Spartans finished the regular season with a 4-2 record while the Rebels were unbeaten. Both teams advanced to provincial quarter finals. On the road to the provincial final, the Eaton Spartans first travelled to Hague where they defeated the Hague Panthers, first in their league, by a score of 42-16. The next weekend, the Spartans were bound for Southey to challenge the Robert Southey Screaming Eagles in the provincial semi-final. The game against the Eagles was an intense match-up between two strong teams. At the end of Q1, Spartans led 16-14; Q2 22-20; Q3 44-20 and a final score of 44-36. The Spartans were off to Kerrobert to take on the Rebels for the 6-Man 1A Provincial title! It was the first time in 20 years that the Spartans would play for the Provincial Championship, having won back-to-back titles in 1998 & 1999 when Coaches Clint Hayes and Chad Guidinger were players on the teams.

The sidelines at Kerrobert were flooded with Spartan fans sporting school colors of black, red and white and cheering on the Spartans in their quest for the championship title. After the kickoff, Kerrobert Rebels were first on the board. Spartans battled back to score their own touchdown and then shortly after, an interception by the Spartans led to a second touchdown. At the end of the first quarter, the score was 12-8 for the Spartans. In the second quarter, Spartans scored a trio of touchdowns; Rebels got some momentum back with a couple of their own. At the half, Eatonia led 30-26. In the second half, the Rebels started with the ball and were able to take the lead 34-30. The Spartans soon took over, completing a couple more touchdowns of their own, bringing the score to 44-40 for the Spartans at the end of the third. It was definitely a nail-biter of a game! The final quarter saw the Spartans put up another 19 points through strong offensive and defensive play. Spartans were victorious, defeating the previously undefeated Rebels, with a final score of 63-48. Eaton Spartans are the 2019 1A 6-Man Provincial Champions!

Eaton School, Westcliffe Composite School, the communities of Eatonia and Marengo, and all Spartan Alumni are extremely proud of these boys and their accomplishment. Congratulations to the team:





EATONIA CEMETERY INFORMATION

The Cemetery Committee has completed Year 2 of projects working toward the challenging goal of improvements designed for beautification and easier maintenance.

Included were:

- 1) the ditch repair and grass seeding by the Dept. of Highways.
- 2) the planting of 58 Colorado spruce trees on two sides of the property with the installation of drip irrigation. Ron Theaker is to be recognized for his donation of the trencher while the town employees provided the labour. All costs were met by the committee.
- 3) the installation of two concrete runners on which 40 monuments were placed. Families helped the committee with the cost of construction. R.M. of Chesterfield supplied gravel.
- 4) the removal of 29 concrete and fibreglass grave covers by the town employees for a fee imposed by Town Office. Appreciation is due Lyle Jeffries and Jeff Stevens for supplying topsoil for grave repair.

Looking ahead to Year 3 in 2020, projects planned include:

- 1) the replacement fence along the highway.
- 2) the planting of 100 additional Colorado spruce trees. After a lengthy and costly legal procedure, approximately an acre of land was procured. It will support two rows of trees on three sides of the cemetery.
- 3) the removal of more concrete grave covers. It is disappointing to report of those families who, in 2017, had committed to do their own work, only one has completed the task. We urge the others to help us reach our goal of all covers removed before the Centennial celebration.

As the Centennial Committee anticipates a large attendance, it is expected many will visit the cemetery. We hope everyone with family graves will do their part to ensure these visits are emotionally rewarding. Due to the time restrictions of August 1 completion, the concrete runner project is placed on hold.

Appreciation is extended for the willing assistance from R.M. of Chesterfield and the Town of Eatonia in providing labour and equipment. Thank you to those who have aided our work financially – through private donations and through Donor's Choice. And again, it was most gratifying to be included in the organizations receiving monies from Eatonia Oasis Players.
