## Management's Responsibility

The municipality's management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accompanying consolidated financial statements in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards (PSAS). The preparation of the statements necessarily includes selecting appropriate accounting principles and methods, and making decisions affecting the measurement of transactions in which objective judgments and estimates by management is required.

In discharging its responsibilities for the integrity and fair presentation of the consolidated financial statements, management designs and maintains the necessary accounting, budget and other related internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that transactions are appropriately authorized and accurately recorded, that assets are properly accounted for and safeguarded, and that financial records are properly maintained to provide reliable information for the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.


The Council is composed of elected officials who are not employees of the municipality. The Council is responsible for overseeing management in the performance of its financial reporting responsibilities. The Council fulfils these responsibilities by reviewing the financial information prepared by management and discussing relevant matters with external auditors. The Council is also responsible for recommending the appointment of the municipality's external auditors.

*Close Hauta Bertoia Blanchette*, an independent firm of *Chartered Professional Accountants*, is appointed by the Council to audit the consolidated financial statements and report directly to them; their report follows. The external auditors have full and free access to, and meet periodically and separately with, both the Council and management to discuss their audit findings.

## ABOUT CEMETERIES

For those who do not know me, I establish my right to publish my opinion about the present work at the cemetery by recalling my previous contributions to the community. As mayor and councillor, fate placed me in the position of being able to keep the railway station beside the tracks when all others on the branch line were either moved or demolished. Fate also placed me in the position to be able to bring the Eatonia Community Services Co-operative to Eatonia, which made it possible for the financing of capital projects which the town, being restricted in spending by the Local Government Board, was otherwise unable undertake. The first project financed at arms-length in this way was the Arena and the second was the Community Hall. Others followed and the co-operative is still a part of the fabric of a progressive community. These I count as successes.

My work at the Eatonia Cemetery was less than a success. Although I learned to use divining rods there to find unmarked graves, putting names on them was more difficult. There were at least 105 unmarked graves, the location of each verified by probing, when I began re-drawing the cemetery map. Burial permits which provide identification had been destroyed. Vital statistic records held by the town and rural municipalities provided some names. After the province decided local registrars were no longer needed, it became impossible to view vital statistics records unless a family connection was proved. Small stone markers were placed on previously unmarked graves. Some bore names; others were "unknown adult" or "unknown child". Council passed regulations but was unable to enforce them.

What is happening now is exactly what I envisaged then, including the removal of concrete covers and the replacement of Manchurian Elms by Blue Spruce, which are not subject to deer damage. I also wanted to see the realignment of grave markers on concrete curbs, as is being done now. Why there is any dissension over the work which is being done is beyond my understanding.

The cemetery is not a place for insisting on a wide range of individual preferences. It is a memorial for a whole band of people who have contributed to community, for good or for ill. One day soon my gravestone will appear there on a concrete curb.

Without reservation, I approve of the work which is being done at the cemetery and the people who are doing it.

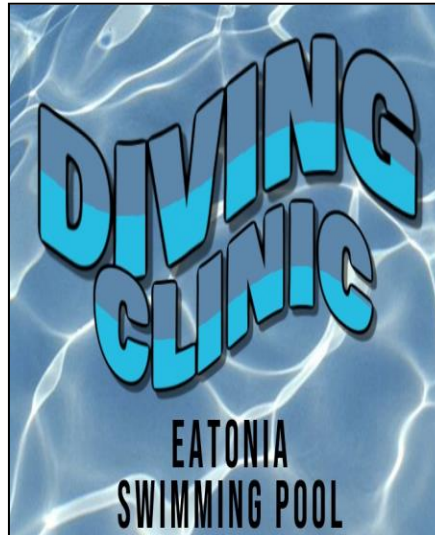

Improvement projects at Eatonia cemetery are ongoing.

Council requests the cooperation of families with monuments in the cemetery.

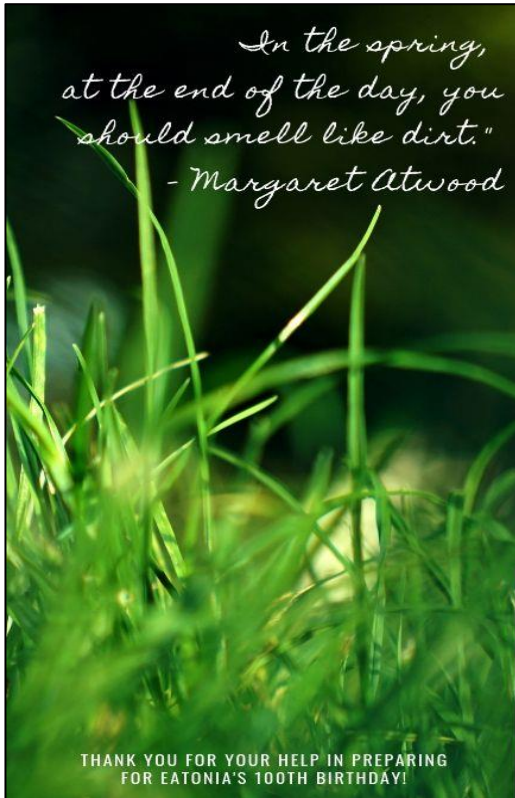
Ornamentation not attached to a monument, which hinders maintenance is not permitted as outline in the town cemetery bylaw. This includes flowers not in a permanent vase, wreaths, plaques and glassware.

A single solar light may be placed on the side of a monument. A holder for a floral arrangement fastened on the top of a monument is an attractive alternative. Permanent vases are encouraged.

For a recent interment flowers may be placed on the grave for a period not to exceed 3 months.

We ask that the memorial items be removed or corrected by June 16. After this date these items may be removed from the cemetery by the maintenance employees.

As well, removal of fibreglass and concrete grave covers is a work in progress with a goal to be completed by the 2020 Centennial celebration. Families will continue to be contacted. Should any family wish to undertake the project on their own behalf, it is important to first make the Town Office aware.
