## WE REMEMBER ... AND WE APPRECIATE

Bright red maple leaf markers with Canadian flags blowing in the wind throughout, Eatonia cemetery portrays a poignant message as we approach November 11 – Remembrance Day.

Kindersley Legion, in a benevolent project spearheaded by David Burke, placed markers on 40 WWI and WWII veterans' monuments with more to be installed. They also donated a plaque in honour of eight local men who served in the Boer War of 1898-1902. Two of these men, Charles Bailey and Major Charles Craig, are buried in the cemetery. The plaque, currently on display in the Town Office will be placed in the Legion room at the Station Museum. What a patriotic gesture! Be generous to the poppy fund!

Another project saw eight veterans' monuments receive facelifts from Veterans Affairs Canada through a contract filled by Cliff Neufeld of Kindersley.

The preservation of the gate from the original iron fence is most significant. It bears a plaque donated by Delia F. Craig in loving memory of her husband Charles E. Craig. Charles Craig was a founding father of the community north of Mantario which he named Craig-lands. After his settlement in 1911, his achievements were far-reaching, including starting Craiglands post office and school. He became secretary for the RM of Royal Canadian, living in Laporte from 1921 until his passing in 1932. Take time to read his story in *A Past To Cherish Vol.1*, page 135, and *Vol. 2*, page 122. Major Charles Craig is in the Arnott Larock family tree.

The centennial project of planting 100 spruce trees in a year of environmental extremes has been challenging. Appreciation is extended to the following for their help: Bob Quinney, Ron and Jan Becker, Ray Cooper, the Brent and Kim Watts' families, Stevens' brothers – John, Joel and Grady with friend Jack Hartell, and to Doug Bailey and Jim Martin for hauling thousands of gallons of water.

Recognition of the many work projects this year is appropriate. An efficient town crew removed many grave covers and Hannah Eckstein with the "big" mower certainly improved the highway ditch. Ted Miller kept the grounds neatly mowed and trimmed and Focus assisted with weed control. The RM of Chesterfield transported topsoil generously donated, for a second year, by Jeff Stevens.

Kudos to several families who undertook their own projects; these included cover removal, replacing deteriorated concrete inscriptions with new monuments, and seeding grass. (Orange lichen left unchecked will render many an inscription unreadable.) To see exemplary lichen removal to restore older monuments, visit the Stevens' family plot!

Thank you to Sam Somerville for the welcomed "relief" station. Finally, our appreciation to all those who have supported cemetery improvements financially with private donations and through Donor's Choice.

# Voting safely is our priority for this election!

This municipal election will be different than in the past. We will have new processes and safety measures in place to protect voters, election workers, candidates or candidate representatives at the poll. Some things you may notice include:

- Physical distancing in the poll. Voters will be asked to stay 2 meters (6 feet) apart. If you see someone at the poll waiting to vote, please remain outside until it is your turn.
- Voters will enter through the front door and exit out the back door of the office.
- We strongly recommend wearing a mask. If you do not have one, we will have some available for you to use.
- Hand sanitizer will be available.
- Surfaces in the poll will be disinfected throughout the day
- Single-use pencils will be provided.
- Voters who feel unwell on Election Day should stay home. Avoid not being able to vote by exploring other voting options such as mail-in-ballot or advance poll.

#### TOWN OF EATONIA MUNICIPAL ELECTION

#### WHO CAN VOTE

A person is eligible to vote in the municipal election for the office of Councillor if that person meets the following requirements on Election Day:

- Is at least 18 years of age; and
- Is a Canadian citizen; and
- Has resided in Saskatchewan for at least 6 consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election; and
- Has resided in the Town of Eatonia or on land now in the Town, for at least 3 consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election **OR** is the owner of assessable land in the Town, or land now situated in the Town, for at least 3 consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

#### ACCEPTABLE VOTER IDENTIFICATION

- A valid Saskatchewan Driver's License that includes civic address
- A valid Saskatchewan ID card issued by SGI or any motor license issuer
- Any other valid government issued photo ID issued by a Canadian government whether federal, provincial or municipal, or an agency of that government, as long as it includes your name and civic address

#### ACCEPTABLE NON-PHOTO IDENTIFICATION

In the absence of valid photo ID, voters must have two pieces of identification, both of which have the voter's names, and at least one of which also has his/her civic address. For example, a Canadian passport is not an acceptable form of photo ID because it does not contain your civic address; however, a Canadian passport can be used as identification if paired with another document that has your name and civic address on it. For a complete list of acceptable identification view Table 1 of Appendix D of *The Local Government Election Regulations, 2015* or stop by the town office to view the list.


