Eatonia Cemetery
Editor, The Enterprise,
Eatonia, Sask.

Dear Sir:

First of all, Mr. Editor, I must say thank you for the interest you have shown for the care of our cemetery in The Enterprise, but I am not very much interested in all those weak-kneed objections you were telling us about lately, but from past experience I know they exist.

In the pioneer days I organized Royal Canadian R. M., also promoted our first municipal hospital at Kindersley and various schools. I found objections all 'round.

At the Coast the most beautiful places to be found are the cemeteries, and thousands of visitors can be seen Sundays and other days also viewing the lawns, flowers, shrubs and trees. The grave markers are laid flat a few inches below ground; the power mower passes over; also a sunken vase for flowers. A family plot just requires \$10.00 on the purchase price of the the plot for perpetual care. In the older part of the cemetery the stones are left standing. Of course, you can have vaults or cremation if you choose.

I would like to see a meeting called at the discretion of our editor and a cemetery committee appointed with a real live secretary to contact the various groups such as churches, home makers, ladies aid, legion, the rural municipalities.

We could have a pipe line laid and a modern sprinkler system; flowers, shrubs and trees—a beauty spot. A beauty spot to mark the resting place of those pioneers who made this country worth fighting for and also a symbol of respect for those who are living.

My forefathers are buried in a cemetery four miles from town in Ontario, where there is a live committee for care of same. Church service is held every summer and the collection taken more than pays for the care of the cemetery. I am enclosing a program of the service on August 7th of this year.

Of course all of these things take time and money, but the proper amount of enthusiasm will overcome those imaginary objections.

So let us have a beauty spot on our highway to commemorate the dead pioneers. It will also be the guinea stamp stamp of the good citizens of the Eatonia community.

THE SUMMER OF 2020 AT EATONIA CEMETERY

In anticipation of the Centennial celebration, major projects were planned. The summer saw many completed.

They were:

- the new fence along the front of the property
- the planting of 100 Colorado spruce trees and subsequent nurturing
- intensive weed control
- an historical marker of two fieldstone pillars framing the gate from the original iron fence (constructed by Phil Wagner in his Machine Shop)

More history is revealed in this letter to the Editor from the *Eatonia Enterprise* dated September 1, 1949. It was discovered in the treasured collection donated to the museum by Joan Bailey. The writer, Charlie Bailey, is an honored veteran of the Boer War of 1898-1902. He is the grandfather and great grandfather of the local Bailey families.

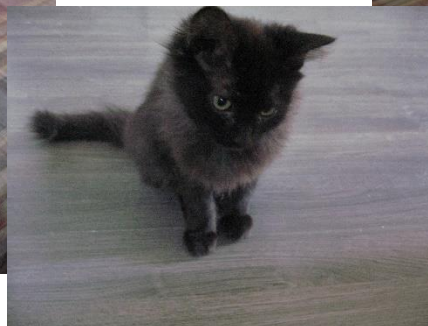
Kittens to a Good Home

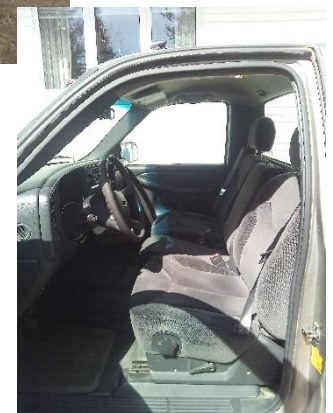

Fall Activity Guidelines

Trick-or-Treating

Trick-or-treating is permitted with the following measures in place:

Neighbourhood Trick-or-Treating

- Two metres distance must be maintained between individuals who are not in the same household/extended household at all times.
- No direct physical contact should occur between trick-or-treaters and people distributing Halloween treats.
- Participants should consider using tools (e.g. tongs) to distribute candy at a distance.
- Physical distancing must be used when approaching houses (i.e. wait until group ahead is gone, take turns). For houses or neighbourhoods anticipating a high volume of trick-or-treaters, people distributing candy are encouraged to place tape markers every two metres between doorways and sidewalks/driveways to promote physical distancing.
- Due to the number of people potentially touching the treats prior to being handed out, consider cleaning candy wrappers with disinfectant wipes or holding the treats for 72 hours before consuming.
- Only wrapped, store-bought treats should be distributed.
- Common touch areas (e.g. handrails, doorbells, doorknobs, etc.) should be frequently cleaned and disinfected while distributing candy.
- Trick-or-treaters should practise frequent hand hygiene by carrying portable hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN number).
- People distributing candy should practise frequent hand hygiene while handing out Halloween treats.
- Trick-or-treaters should consider incorporating non-medical masks (e.g. cloth or other materials) into their costumes, while ensuring their eyes are not covered for safety reasons.
- Individuals handing out candy should consider wearing non-medical masks (e.g. cloth or other materials) where two metres of physical distance cannot be maintained.
- Where possible, only one household member should hand out candy.
- Alternatives to trick-or-treating may be considered, such as:
 - Costume viewing from windows/virtual/photos.
 - Decorating households and yards for viewing from afar.
 - A costume parade where physical distancing can be maintained.

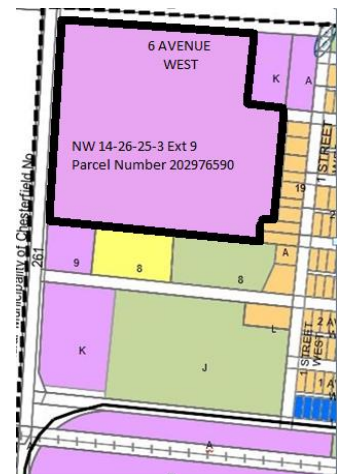

Eatonia Property

Due to the many recent concerns and rumors that have been brought about regarding the acquisition of property bordering the west side of town, we felt the situation must be directly addressed to ease the growing concerns.

In the winter of 2019, the property was purchased privately from Lloyd Adams by Sam, Kenny and Bryan Somerville, and Matthew McKinnon. The intent of the purchase is to secure a location for the West Central Consignment Auction Sale. This event has been providing a service for local farmers and residents of the West Central area for decades. The Consignment sale has been growing substantially over the past years and now requires a secure location to continue. This sale provides a tremendous benefit to all local farmers and residents.

After the purchase of the property, the property line was identified for due diligence in order to install a planned chain link fence. This fence is required for the security of auction equipment. Once the property line was identified by survey, we realized that the line was going through bordering properties and began speaking with the impacted land owners to address this issue.

It was explained to the owners that there is absolutely no intention of putting the planned fence through their property. In fact, the planned fence would be on the other side (west side) of the trees and caragana rows and would not be visible. We had also taken steps to sell a portion of the property to the town as a buffer between the fenced area and bordering properties. In addition, a subsequent portion of property has been set aside to add to the buffered area.

There have been concerns brought to our attention recently that the area will be used for an industrial complex, factory or fertilizer facility. This is NOT the case. The ONLY intentions of the property are to secure the auction equipment for future sales.

At this time, there are no plans to put up a building however future growth of the auction may require a cold storage building for the auction. We would not proceed with this building without notifying the town council and impacted neighbors.

We look forward to continuing with the West Central Consignment Sale and providing this dependable service to the region.

What we do not want is unsubstantiated rumors about our intentions with this land. We have been active members of this community for many years. We acknowledge that this a change for the town and sometimes change can be unnerving, however we would much rather address issues directly.

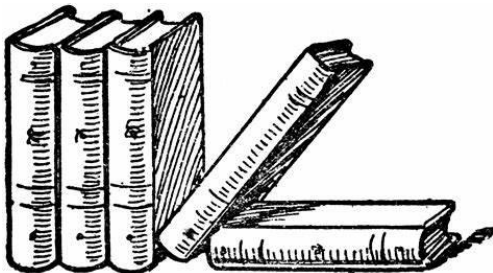
