TOWN OF EATONIA - PUBLIC NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Eatonia intends to adopt a bylaw under The Planning and Development Act, 2007 to amend Bylaw No. 5/16, known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

The proposed Zoning Bylaw amendment will:

Provide for a reduced minimum rear yard site requirement for accessory buildings existing prior to July 30th, 2017

 Rezone proposed Lot 12, Block 19 from partially IND – Industrial District and partially R1 – Residential Single Dwelling District to IND – Industrial District

 Rezone proposed Lots 13 – 17, Block 19 from partially IND – Industrial District and partially R1 – Residential Single Dwelling District to R1 – Residential Single Dwelling District



REASON

- To accommodate accessory buildings that existed prior to the passing of the Zoning Bylaw.
- To facilitate zoning bylaw compliance in an existing subdivision.

PUBLIC INSPECTION

Any person may inspect the bylaws at the Town Office, located at 202 Main Street, Eatonia, SK between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Monday to Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Copies of the bylaws are available at the Town Office at a cost.

PUBLIC HEARING

Council will hold a public hearing in conjunction with their regular meeting at 7:00 p.m. on November 9, 2021 at the Town of Eatonia Council Chambers – 202 Main Street, Eatonia, SK to hear any person or group who wishes to comment on the proposed bylaws. Council will also consider written comments received at the hearing or delivered to the Town office to the undersigned prior to the hearing.

A Tribute to John Douglas "Jack" Schuh

Jack Schuh passed away on October 10, 2021 at the age of 94 at the Foothills Hospital in Calgary. He has been described as "a legend of his time", "one of a kind", "a great storyteller", "larger than life", and the "best neighbour". It seems fitting to remember Jack by thinking of his four passions: **flying, farming, food and family.** Of all Jack's accomplishments he was most proud of his family.

Jack was the eldest of two children born to Rhine and Ella (Reed) Schuh of Laporte, SK on September 8, 1927 and grew up on the family farm south of Laporte with his parents and Sister Jeanette. As a young boy, Jack attended Royal Canadian School. He often spoke about how he used to ride his little pony from the farm to school. As an adventurous young man, Jack enjoyed fixing and riding old military motorcycles and old cars. Later he became interested in flying and in the late forties he obtained his first airplane "Rudolph" and became a "Flying Farmer". Rumour has it that he started flying because he got too many speeding tickets and traded his brand-new car for an airplane! He joined the "Saskatchewan Flying Farmers" in the early fifties and eventually built a runway and huge aircraft hangar on the farm. His love of aviation influenced many others, including his children and grandchildren, to follow in his footsteps. Throughout his lifetime Jack was called upon to do several mercy flights, saving a boy who overdosed on pills and a girl who got her leg caught in an auger.

Jack started a business in Saskatoon called "Schuh Distributors" and later returned to the farm to begin his farming career. He also ran a coin laundry business in Drumheller which he was able to check on during his frequent trips between the farm and Calgary.

Jack married Patricia Anderson on November 21, 1953 in Calgary. Apparently, Jack dated a couple of the Anderson sisters before choosing Patricia as his true love and lifelong partner. He loved Grandma Anderson's good meals no matter which of her daughters he was dating...he had it made in the shade...goodlooking girls and good food! Jack and Pat pulled a travel trailer with a 1952 Chev to Miami where they spent their honeymoon.

It was from that time that Jack and Pat embarked on a 68-year marriage that took them from the farm in Saskatchewan to city life in Calgary and countless adventures in between; adventures that would include their own five children of three boys and two girls, extended family, and many friends. Later in life, they helped to raise two granddaughters at their home in Calgary.

He and Pat would stay on the farm from seeding until harvest each year and then pack up the family and move back to Calgary for the winter months. For interim trips throughout the summer, Jack would fly the family back and forth. A highlight of the family's summer vacation was attending the Abbotsford Airshow, which involved camping in fields and parking lots along the way, but it was all worth it to make it to the Abbotsford Airshow! Until their health began to decline, Jack and Pat continued to come out to the farm every spring and fall to help with seeding and harvest and to enjoy their beloved homestead. Jack created the company "Schuh & Sons Farms" and Tim stayed on the farm and took over the operation in the late 1980's. Tim recalls his dad being in Burger King in Calgary when he discovered that you could buy one burger and get one free. So, Jack proceeded to order 100 burgers and brought them to the farm and froze them to feed the family and the hired help! Rumour has it that Jack would often keep a spare hamburger under the seat in his car in case of emergency.

Jack was an original member of the Calgary Winter Club where he enjoyed curling and many other activities with the family. In Eatonia, he was an active member of the Lion's Club for many years. He was also a faithful member of the Catholic Church, both in Eatonia and in Calgary.

Jack had a love for music. At one point he bought out an entire music store and gave musical instruments to many of his family members which many of them still have to this day. Jack would often be seen conducting his favourite song with his shaky finger.

He is fondly remembered for his grace at family dinners that turned into a combination cry/laugh when he thanked the Lord so intensely for his time with family, for his uncontrollable belly laugh when he watched the dancing Santa Claus or the laughing Elmo, for his fascination in feeding the birds and squirrels in his backyard as he chanted "Chick a dee dee dee" to all the outdoor creatures, for the huge breakfasts he would make, (complete with very creative omelettes - you never knew what might be in them- and Mickey Mouse-shaped pancakes), and for his common phrase, "Oh garsh!". Jack had mastered the art of eating at a smorgasbord by starting off with cantaloupe as sideboards on his plate. He loved Werther's candies and apple juice and of course ice cream to fill in the cracks.

Throughout all the good times in his life, he also endured human struggles such as crop failures, financial stress, health problems, and during his last years a not-so-desirable quality of life. When the family said their final goodbyes to Jack in the hospital, they admired his black hair at 94 years old (must be because his kids never gave him any stress). They told him to have a safe flight to heaven and, if he could, to please fly by the farm on his way. The night after his passing, the northern lights filled the sky with such brilliance. To witness them, we could not help but believe that Jack was having a most divine flight and that he had some small part in that spectacular display over Saskatchewan that night – a place that he loved dearly and always called home.

Jack is lovingly remembered and survived by his wife of 68 years Patricia, children – Bob (Cathy), Mike, Tim (Yvette), Julie (Dave), Tricia (Mack); grandchildren – Chris, Danny, Travis, Lindsay, Kelsey, Breanne, Lara, Cassidy, and Jackson. He is predeceased by his father – Rhine, mother – Ella, sister – Jeanette, and twin sons in infancy. A funeral service was held for Jack on October 16 at Chapel of the Bells in Calgary followed by interment at Queen's Park Cemetery. In lieu of flowers a memorial donation may be made to the Mount Royal Aviation Scholarship Fund, www.mru.ca/JackSchuh, in tribute to Jack Schuh.

The family would like to thank all those who travelled to attend the funeral and those who shared condolences through phone calls, visits, cards, flowers, food, donations, prayers, and warm messages and stories of Jack. THANK YOU...your kindness and kind words will never be forgotten
