#### **UTILITY ACCOUNT OVERDUE INTEREST**

As per Bylaw No. 13/21, effective January 1, 2022, the interest rate for outstanding utility accounts over 30 days will be 5% per month. This has increased from 2% per month.

#### **EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2022**

There will be a rate increase to water, sewer and recycling rates charged on the utility bills. You will notice this increase on your next utility bill mailed out on March 1, 2022.

For residential the rate increases are as follows (per billing):

Minimum Water Fee - \$105.60

Overage Rate for Water - \$9.80 per 1,000 gallons or part thereof

Sewer Fee - \$23.44

Recycling - \$14.00

The water and sewer rates are being increased to build up the utility reserve for future projects such as sewer relining, water line replacement or water treatment plant upgrades.

The recycling rates are being increased due to an increase being passed down to the town from Triways Disposal Services.

#### Management's Responsibility

The municipality's management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accompanying consolidated financial statements in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards (PSAS). The preparation of the statements necessarily includes selecting appropriate accounting principles and methods, and making decisions affecting the measurement of transactions in which objective judgments and estimates by management is required.

In discharging its responsibilities for the integrity and fair presentation of the consolidated financial statements, management designs and maintains the necessary accounting, budget and other related internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that transactions are appropriately authorized and accurately recorded, that assets are properly accounted for and safeguarded, and that financial records are properly maintained to provide reliable information for the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

The Council is composed of elected officials who are not employees of the municipality. The Council is responsible for overseeing management in the performance of its financial reporting responsibilities. The Council fulfils these responsibilities by reviewing the financial information prepared by management and discussing relevant matters with external auditors. The Council is also responsible for recommending the appointment of the municipality's external auditors.

CHBB Chartered Professional Accountants, an independent firm of Chartered Professional Accountants, is appointed by the Council to audit the consolidated financial statements and report directly to them; their report follows. The external auditors have full and free access to, and meet periodically and separately with, both the Council and management to discuss their audit findings.

## Construction Codes Advisory

Promoting construction of safe, healthy, habitable buildings



#### Information at a Glance

Effective July 1, 2022, all buildings in Saskatchewan with sleeping rooms are required to provide early warning protection against the effects of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, smoke and fire.

The installation of CO and smoke alarms is the most effective way of accomplishing this requirement.

When a building with sleeping rooms contains a fuel-burning appliance, or an attached vehicle parking garage, CO alarms must be installed:

- inside each sleeping room; OR
- outside each sleeping room within 5 meters (16 feet) of each sleeping room door.

When a building contains sleeping rooms, smoke alarms must be installed:

ms must be installed: on each floor level of a building, including the level with sleeping rooms, with the smoke alarm

defined in the NBC 2015.

Compliance with The Construction Codes

Code of Canada 2015 (NBC 2015) is


Act, Regulations and the National Building

addressed in this advisory. Words in italic,

other than Act and Regulation titles are

- located between the sleeping rooms and the remainder of the floor; AND
- inside each sleeping room.


