



- 2. Installation of two flag poles proudly flying Saskatchewan and Canadian flags
- 3. Fifty-four weathered Veterans' flags were replaced to commemorate Centennial
- 4. A landscaping project in the area of the memorial wall was completed with cement curbing and shale; our thanks to the RM of Chesterfield for transporting the shale from Battleford.
- 5. Block 1 improvements by a professional monumental company; many monuments were lifted, straightened and righted in whatever work was required. The work was labour-intensive, time consuming and although reasonably contracted, still costly. Some families expressed their gratitude with helpful monetary donations. These were gratefully received.

Heartwarming moments experienced:

- * Neighbouring communities have been inspired by what they see and have instigated their own cemetery improvement projects.
- * Local families providing care to their loved ones' resting places
- * A fellow coming from a distance, bringing a helper (a retired funeral director) to scrub lichen from three family monuments
- * A gentleman, 87 years old from BC, bringing two inscribed granite markers and with the help of family from Medicine Hat, replacing the deteriorated concrete headstones of his parents

The Cemetery Committee members were saddened with the passing of Bill Wardill. A sign recognizing his years of dedicated work in the cemetery has been placed on the historical gate.

The committee is comprised of Darcy Scott, Cheryl Bailey, Leah Cooper, Brent Watts, Jerry and Bernice Radies, and Jim and Belva Martin. Matt McKinnon has taken Doug Bredy's seat as town council representative.


