Pool Liner Replacement



The Rec Board needs to replace the liner this fall, at a cost of \$162,180. The Eatonia Community Co-operative is financially supporting this project. The Rec Board is appreciative of this financially assistance, without this help the project would not happen. The Rec Board's goal is to repay the Community Co-operative back for their assistance. - If the project is approved, the Cooperative has the ability to finance the project if the available funds do not cover the cost.

Swimming Pool Liner Replacement Project

One of the Cooperative's newest projects is to financially support the Swimming Pool Liner Project being undertaken by the Eatonia Recreation Board. The goal is to begin the replacement of the liner in September 2023, following this summer's pool season, and finish the project in June 2024, if needed.

Donations to the Swimming Pool Liner Project can be made directly to the Eatonia Rec Board.

New Fire Hall Project

The Cooperative (ECSC) has joined forces with CEN (Chesterfield, Eatonia, Newcombe) Fire Protection Association to purchase a new Fire Hall in Eatonia which will provide services to the residents within the community of Eatonia and the rural municipalities of Chesterfield and Newcombe.

The Eatonia & District Fire Brigade provides necessary services with the intent being to minimalize loss of life and property in all aspects of Volunteer Emergency Response, including responding to home, building & grass fires, as well as emergency vehicular and critical incidents. The support of CEN residents is needed.

Any and all donations can be made to the Eatonia Community Services Cooperative and tax receipts will be issued.

NEW EATONIA & DISTRICT FIRE HALL

Sponsored by Eatonia Community Services Cooperative and The CEN (Chesterfield, Eatonia, Newcombe) Fire Protection Association

The Mission:

The Eatonia & District Fire Brigade provides necessary services to the residents within the community of Eatonia and the rural municipalities of Chesterfield and Newcombe with the intent being to minimalize loss of life and property in all aspects of Volunteer Emergency Response, including responding to home, building & grass fires, as well as emergency vehicular and critical incidents.

The Background:

In February 2022, CEN
(Chesterfield, Eatonia, and
Newcombe) Fire Protection
Association was in the early planning stages of building a new Fire
Hall in Eatonia which would
provide services to the residents
within CEN.

CEN approached the Eatonia Community Services Cooperative with a request to consider financially supporting a new Fire Hall project.

The Options:

- Wood structure, insulated shell, approximately \$550 000 plus utilities hook-up and cost of land purchase
- Pre-cast concrete shell structure, approximately \$800 000, plus utilities hook-up and cost of land purchase
- Purchase former Focus building (60x60x18) with 2 overhead doors, tin on inside walls, infloor heat, office on main level, conference room on 2nd level, utilities in place, and land building sits upon (sub-divided), \$550 000





The Decision:

With the support of the Eatonia Community Services Co-operative, The CEN Fire Protection Association will purchase the former Focus building from Matt McKinnon and Kenny Somerville.

The building will serve as the new Eatonia & District Fire Hall, accommodating the 2 fire trucks, a water truck and the rescue truck.

The three entities of CEN have made a 3 year commitment of 50% of the total cost. The Cooperative (ECSC) will be financially responsible for the other 50%.

If you are a resident of Chesterfield, Eatonia, or Newcombe, your support is needed!


