Battery Recycling drop off at Town of Eatonia Office

Safety – Proper Taping Technique

When it comes to battery safety, a little bit of precaution goes a long way. Over-taping can actually prevent batteries from being effectively recycled.

Which batteries require tape?

Most alkaline batteries are safe to deposit into Call2Recycle collection boxes without any terminal protection.

Only lithium, lithium-ion (Li-Ion), small sealed lead acid (SSLA/PB), button/cell and alkaline batteries over 12 volts require terminal protection.

DO:

- Cover the positive (+) terminal with tape.
- Use a single piece of tape large enough to cover the terminal.
- Use a non-conductive tape, such as packing tape, electrical tape, or duct tape.

DON'T:

- Cover the battery chemistry.
- Completely enclose the battery with tape; make sure it can be peeled off easily at the sorting stage.
- Use masking tape, Scotch™ tape, or painter's tape



Management's Responsibility

The municipality's management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accompanying consolidated financial statements in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards (PSAS). The preparation of the statements necessarily includes selecting appropriate accounting principles and methods, and making decisions affecting the measurement of transactions in which objective judgments and estimates by management is required.

In discharging its responsibilities for the integrity and fair presentation of the consolidated financial statements, management designs and maintains the necessary accounting, budget and other related internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that transactions are appropriately authorized and accurately recorded, that assets are properly accounted for and safeguarded, and that financial records are properly maintained to provide reliable information for the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

The Council is composed of elected officials who are not employees of the municipality. The Council is responsible for overseeing management in the performance of its financial reporting responsibilities. The Council fulfils these responsibilities by reviewing the financial information prepared by management and discussing relevant matters with external auditors. The Council is also responsible for recommending the appointment of the municipality's external auditors.

CHBB Chartered Professional Accountants, an independent firm of *Chartered Professional Accountants*, is appointed by the Council to audit the consolidated financial statements and report directly to them; their report follows. The external auditors have full and free access to, and meet periodically and separately with, both the Council and management to discuss their audit findings.

The **Eatonia Heritage Board** is seeking to hire a student or students to act as a tour guide as well as to look after cleaning the buildings and light grounds keeping duties.





