

WATER AND SEWER RATE INCREASE

Effective January 1, 2024, there will be a water and sewer rate increase charged on the utility bills. You will notice this increase on your next utility bill mailed out on March 1, 2024.

For residential the rate increase is as follows per month:

CHARGE	NEW RATE	OLD RATE	INCREASE
Water Fee	\$58.08	\$52.80	\$5.48
Sewer Fee	\$12.89	\$11.72	\$1.17
Water Overage Rate	\$10.78 per 1000 gallons or part thereof	\$9.90 per 1000 gallons or part thereof	

Water and sewer revenue is to cover operating expenditures which includes waterworks' staff salaries, benefits, and training; power, heat; insurance; chemicals; repairs; maintenance; supplies; etc. and to build up a reserve for future capital projects such as sewer relining, water line replacement or water treatment plant upgrades.

The Council is working towards water and sewer work revenues that cover water and sewer works expenditures and capital purchases. To accomplish this, the rates need to increase over time so that the revenues cover operating and capital costs.

Waterworks are to be self-financing, where the users pay for the costs of the service. Self-financing utility works will reduce pressure on property taxes.



Kailynn's Story

A 10 second glance away from the road can change your life forever.

August 16, 2018 changed my life forever. My 16-year-old daughter Kailynn was involved in a train vehicle collision near Weyburn, SK, Canada. Fighting for her life for 6 days, Kailynn died from severe head trauma on August 22. She had turned 17 just a day prior. The cause of Kailynn's accident was found to be driver inexperience and distracted driving.


Kailynn's Story is real, heartbreaking, and impactful. My goal in sharing this story is to educate others on how decisions they make when they get into the driver's seat can change their lives forever. Through photos, words, and song, I share my life as it is now, Kailynn's life as it was, and Kailynn's life that she missed out on.

Bio: Sandra is a road safety speaker, advocating for change in peoples choices regarding distracted driving. Sandra is founder and president of Sharing Kailynn's Sunshine Foundation, and a Rail Safety Ambassador with Operation Lifesaver Canada. Sandra has been involved with both SGI (Saskatchewan Government Insurance) and Operation Lifesaver sharing Kailynn's story on both safety platforms. Sandra works full time in Regina helping support students at an adult educational

facility. Sandra is a mother of two and lives with her husband on their farm near Tyvan, SK.



Technology – We can't live without it, but what do we do when we don't need a device anymore?

It's impossible to imagine a day without technology, for example, your tablet – a device you can take everywhere, that acts as a computer, camera, music and movie player, and much more. The evolution of these devices has been rapid; just a few short years ago, multiple devices would have been needed. That multi-functionality makes our lives easier, but it comes with the expectation to think ahead as to what will happen to our devices at the end of their useful life.

For a moment though let's take one step back, while the device is still useful, but you want to replace it what can you do? Can it be used by someone else? Is there a charity; a child or grandparent; a library, school, or church that could use the device you want to replace? If so, consider donating it or selling it at a reduced cost. This allows for the <u>re-use</u> of the device, especially since it still works.

Once a device is at the end of its useful life (or broken and not fixable), it should be <u>recycled</u>. Since 2011 in Eatonia and the surrounding area, residents have recycled electronics through six electronics collection events. From those events a total of **3.5 metric tonnes** have been diverted from the landfill and the environment. Mark your calendars now as there is another one coming up on June 13.

So, what can be recycled? In Saskatchewan, provincial regulations determine what can be recycled through the **Recycle My Electronics**[™] program. Included are: computers, monitors and TVs, printers and scanners, fax machines, stereo equipment, gaming systems, microwaves, phones, audio and video equipment, cable or satellite boxes, and global positioning system (GPS) devices, etc. If the TV is 70 years old, or the latest model that accidentally fell off the wall, it can be recycled. There is no device age restriction, so clean out the garage, basement or the Quonset.

In addition to the actual devices anything that plugs into those devices is also recyclable, such as headphones and earbuds, keyboards, mice, answering machines, modems, and all of the cables that connect them. Remember the small things as well – MP3 players, tape recorders, portable devices. Root through that junk drawer and pull out those charging cables (keep the ones you need and recycle the rest).

And why should we recycle it? All of this material is made of plastics, glass, and metals that when broken down can be put back into the manufacturing supply chain. The glass is sent to smelters to be reused to make new glass. The plastic is pelletized and cleaned. It is then used as the 'recycled' portion of new items made from plastic. For the metal, it is separated into the base commodities of steel, aluminum, gold, copper, silver, etc. The metals can be used for new electronics, jewelry, furniture, or even Olympic medals.

Where does it go once it is dropped at the collection event? The tote bags are picked up by a transporter and sent to a processor in Western Canada. These processors have met international and Canadian standards to ensure that material is handled in an environmentally sound and socially acceptable manner that protects the environment and safeguards worker health and safety. They are audited regularly to ensure they continue to meet these standards. The material is sorted and devices with substances of concern such as lead, mercury, batteries, etc. are handled and recycled in specific ways. The rest of the material stream is broken down into plastics, glass, and metals. Some materials will go straight to a re-user and other materials will go for further processing.

And now you know – There is no need to have these devices take up space in your home, garage, or farm buildings. The devices will be handled safely and securely so that the material they contain can be reused, reducing our reliance on extracting the raw material from the earth. Gather them up and drop them off on June 1 between 10 AM – Noon and 1 – 4 PM behind the town office in Eatonia. Reclaim some space, recycle those devices, and help the planet!
