The above candidates are running for the office of Councillor for the Town of Eatonia; you may only vote for one candidate.

WHO CAN VOTE:

A person is eligible to vote in the town municipal by-election if the following requirements are met:

- · At least 18 years old on election day;
- · A Canadian citizen;
- A resident of Saskatchewan for at least 6 consecutive months before by-election day;
 AND EITHER;
 - A resident of the municipality for at least 3 consecutive months before by-election day;
 OR:
 - An owner of assessable land for at least 3 consecutive months before by-election day.

ACCEPTABLE VOTER IDENTIFICATION:

The purpose of the voter ID requirements is to maintain the integrity of local election processes.

Your name and address must appear in some form on your voter identification documents.

Bringing proper identification will ensure your voice is heard and will help your local by-election run as smoothly as possible.

To prove identity, a voter shall provide to the election officials the following:

- One (1) piece of identification issued by the Government of Canada, the Government of Saskatchewan, a municipality, or a government agency that <u>contains a photograph of the voter and his/her name and address</u>:
- Two (2) pieces of information prescribed in The Local Government Election Regulations, 2015 each
 of which establishes the voter's name and at least one of which establishes the voter's address.

For a complete list of acceptable identification view Appendix D – Table 1 page 76-78 of The Local Government Election Regulations, 2015 or stop by the town to view the list.

A Canadian passport is <u>not</u> an acceptable form of photo identification because it does not contain your address. However, a Canadian passport can be used as identification if paired with another document that has your name and address on it.

INTENT

The proposed Zoning Bylaw amendment will:

 Rezone proposed Lot 24, Block 14 from partially CS – Community Service District and partially R1 – Residential Single Dwelling District to CS – Community Service District



REASON

To facilitate zoning bylaw compliance for a proposed subdivision application.

Council will also consider written comments received at the hearing or delivered to the Town office to the undersigned prior to the hearing.

Management's Responsibility

The municipality's management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accompanying consolidated financial statements in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards (PSAS). The preparation of the statements necessarily includes selecting appropriate accounting principles and methods, and making decisions affecting the measurement of transactions in which objective judgments and estimates by management is required.

In discharging its responsibilities for the integrity and fair presentation of the consolidated financial statements, management designs and maintains the necessary accounting, budget and other related internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that transactions are appropriately authorized and accurately recorded, that assets are properly accounted for and safeguarded, and that financial records are properly maintained to provide reliable information for the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

The Council is composed of elected officials who are not employees of the municipality. The Council is responsible for overseeing management in the performance of its financial reporting responsibilities. The Council fulfils these responsibilities by reviewing the financial information prepared by management and discussing relevant matters with external auditors. The Council is also responsible for recommending the appointment of the municipality's external auditors.

CHBB, Chartered Professional Accountants, an Independent firm of Chartered Professional Accountants, is appointed by the Council to audit the consolidated financial statements and report directly to them; their report follows. The external auditors have full and free access to, and meet periodically and separately with, both the Council and management to discuss their audit findings.


