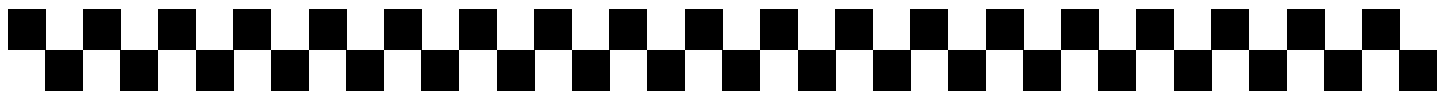
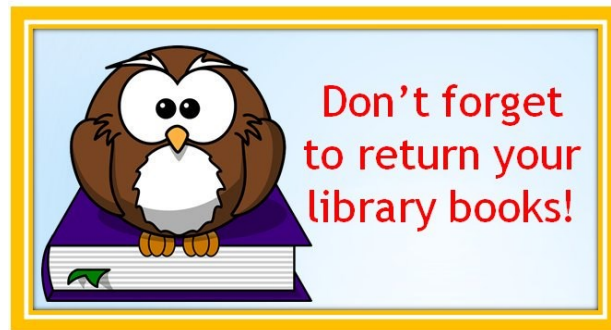

Kindergarten is excited to show they've become readers and writers! They take a 'little book' home each day to read to their family. Everyone, including the students are proud!

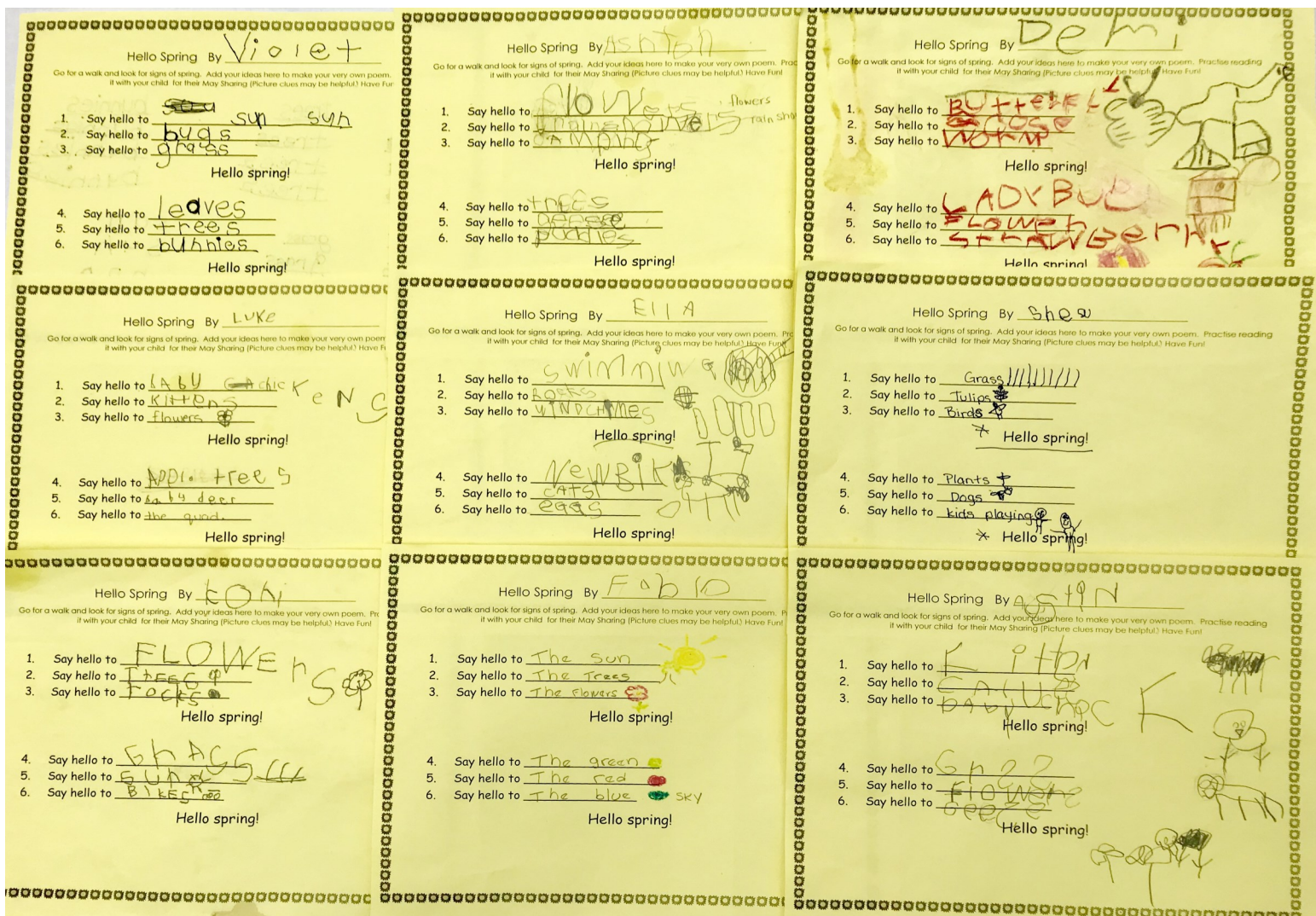
For sharing, every student worked hard with their family to write a 'Hello Spring' poem then read it to the class. It's fun to see their poems come to life!

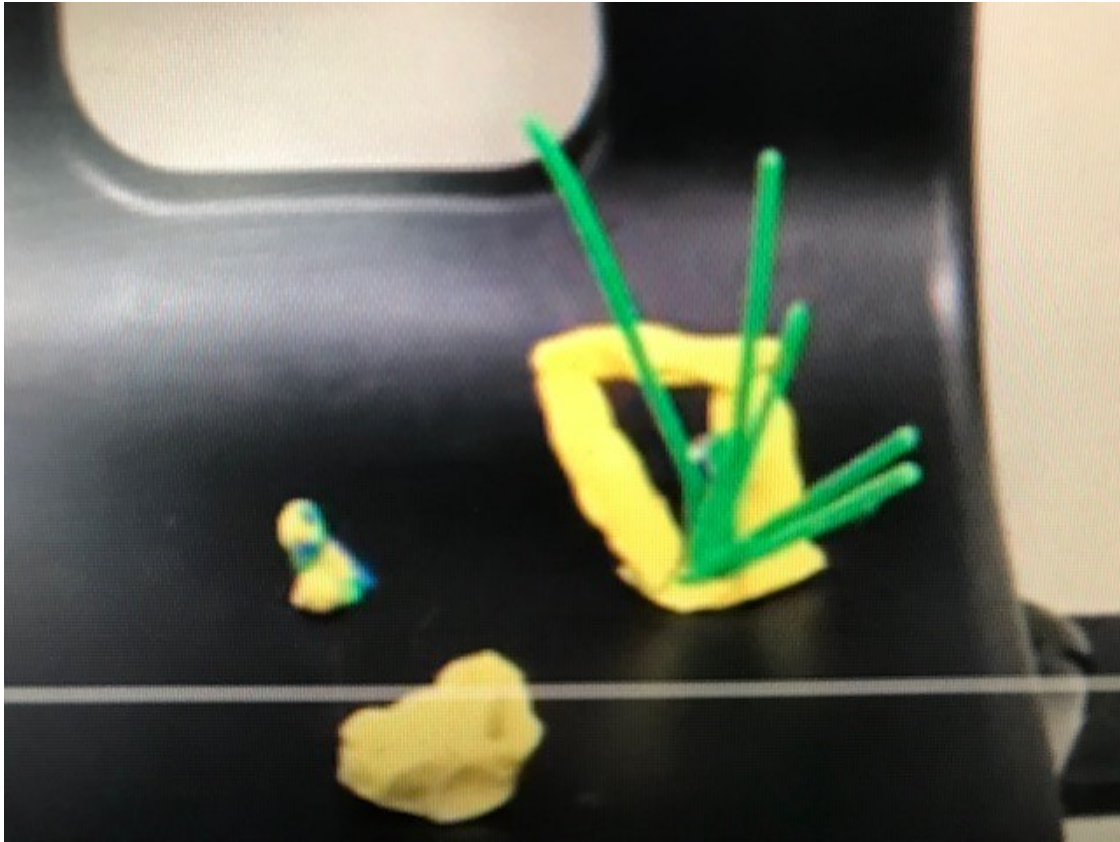

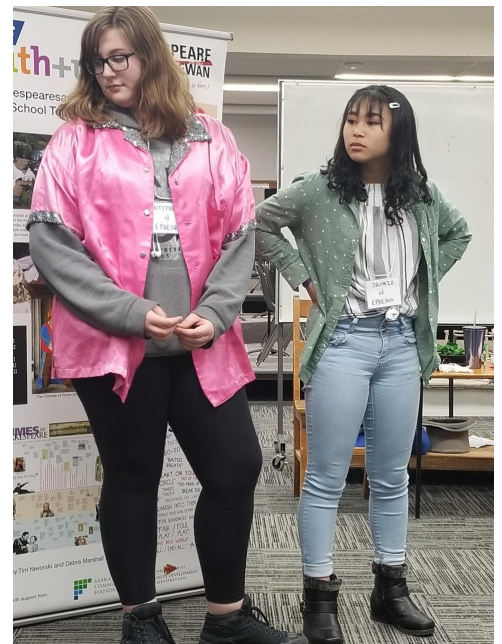
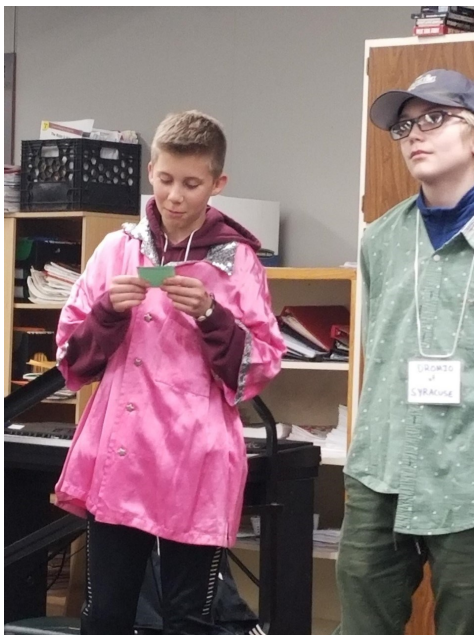
COSTUMES AND PROPS WERE USED IN THIS PRODUCTION.
