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Principal's Message 2020-2021

Looking back, the 2020-2021 school year was uniquely challenging. During a global pandemic, it is strength of character that gets us through. Students and staff spent the year learning to adapt and drawing on creativity to find new ways to learn, grown and celebrate. Love of learning and curiosity prevailed. Spartans were put to the test but they showed true grit, determination and perseverance. In difficult times, it was even more important for Spartans to treat each other with kindness. We can be grateful for all the positives that did come out of this school year:

- Eaton did not have to go to Level 4 Learning from Home at all this entire school year!
- PeBL opportunities included Choice Boards and projects, Story Walks, Book Tasting, Cultural Fair, independent science study, Mentorship Legacy Projects and so much more!
- 1:1 technology is available at Eaton. Technology resources used as tools in teaching and learning, as well as communication, included: See Saw, Remind, Flipgrid, Flipgrid Virtual WebX (ie: Skype), One Note, Teams, No Red Ink, Mathagon, Mathletics, Math Seeds, Epic, RAZ Kids, Moodle, Virtual Author visits, etc.
- Personalized Goals in Reading, Writing, Math were established for students. Teachers and support staff provided support to help students close the gaps that had been identified following COVID lockdown in Spring 2020 and to realize the successful achievement of student goals.
- Over 90% of Eaton parents discussed their child's learning and growth with teachers at Tri-Conferences.
- The positive and inclusive culture of the school was continued by the SRC who held various School Spirit Days and a Kindness Challenge, as well as a couple of COVID protocol appropriate lunches. By creating a mural in the high school end, the GSA continued to promote individuality, diversity and inclusion.
- A number of Sensory Paths were created and placed on the floor of the elementary hallway to provide students with opportunities for body and mindfulness breaks. Calming corners, as well as tanks for fish and axolotls add to the calming effect of our school environment.
- Programs like band and extra-curricular activities continued with COVID protocols when possible by using creativity.
- Gr 5-9 students won \$1000 Resource Package as a prize for participating in a sustainability competition with their project, "If the World Fit into Eatonia". Recycle and compost bins for sustainability are placed throughout the school and in the outdoor classroom.
- Numerous opportunities addressed student and staff Mental Health including Mentorship Coping Mechanisms Projects; Hindsight 2020 Virtual Conference for Gr 10-12, School Counsellor Sandi Toner classroom visits sharing with students how to Fill Your Bucket and create Calming Jars; and the creation of the Sensory Pathways.
- New students to Eaton put their handprints on the wall of Spartans who have left their mark. The Graduating class leave their thumbprints as leaves on our Spartan Tree of Knowledge.
- Eaton's Spartan Outdoor Space (S.O.S.) has created an outdoors environment that includes a focus on agriculture and horticulture where all learners (auditory, visual, kinesthetic) can learn. It also provides a wonderful meeting space for classes/groups to meet. The Outdoor Classroom has further strengthened

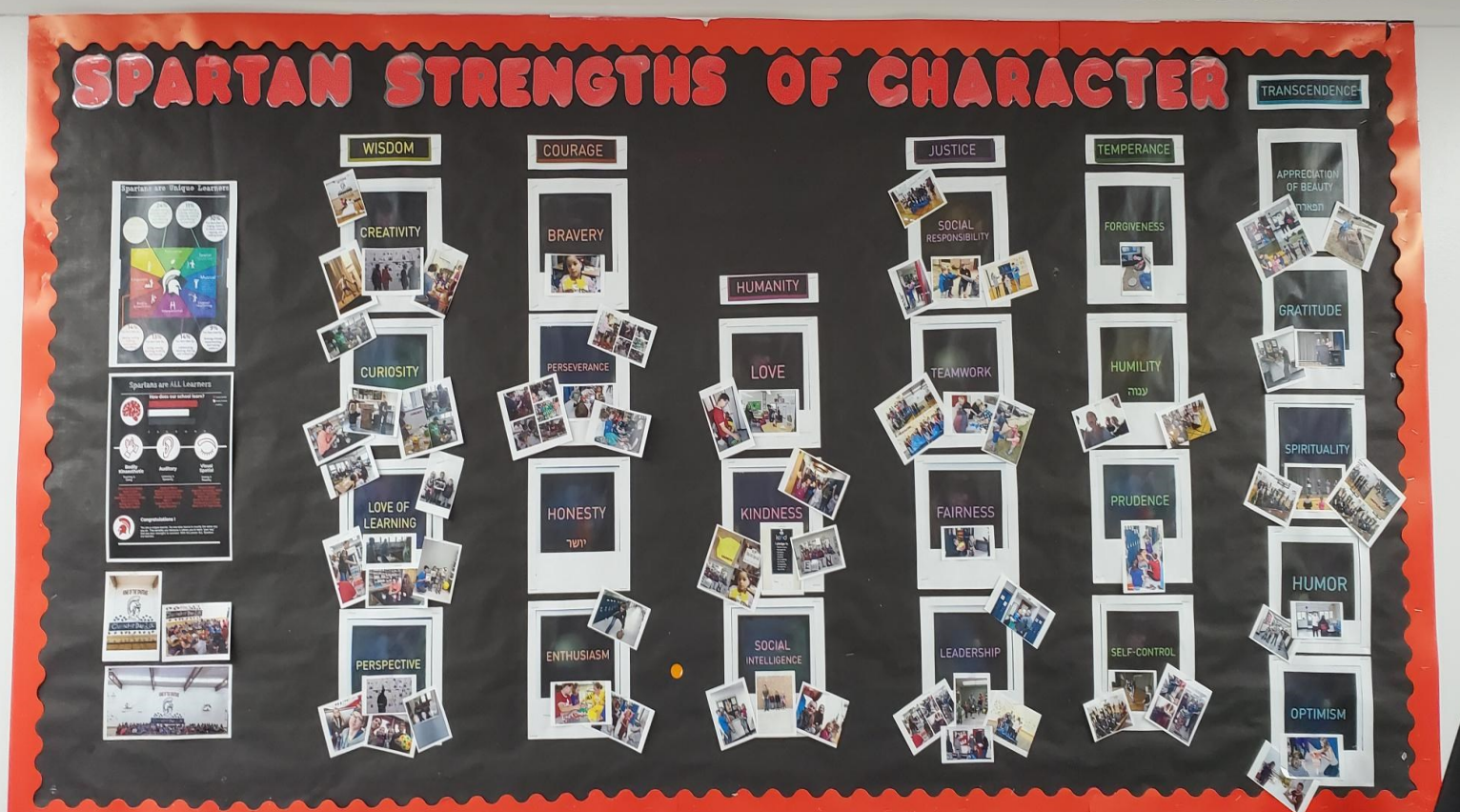
relationships between teachers and learners and between the school and the local community, in particular the agriculture sector. Community support for this project has been incredible!

- Marching Band Performances for the Gr 5/8, 7/8 and 9-12 Concert Bands throughout the community of Eaton creatively gave students the opportunity to work towards a year-end performance goal which they were able to share with the community.
- Eaton SOC engaged families in Virtual Bingo, Virtual Goose Chase Family Fun Event, Pumpkin Carving shared virtually, and the annual Reading Challenge. There was great participation in these events which encouraged families to spend time together during a pandemic.
- We celebrated a milestone with the Graduating Class of 2021.
- The Color Night Awards Ceremony, while being virtual, recognized student achievement.
- There have been many celebrations of character, culture, and skills and knowledge/learning at Eaton throughout the year in various forms: project presentations, pictures, intercom announcements and verbal recognition, School and Division social media, school newsletter Eaton Clippings, community Eatonia Bulletin newsletter, and local media.
- The 2020-2021 Yearbook was completed and sent to the printers. This yearbook "A 'Mask'erade of Memories" encompasses student and staff memories in a one-of-a-kind (we hope) year.

Spartans have many reasons to be appreciative and proud of all the good things in 2020-2021!

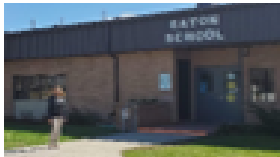

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COLOUR NIGHT 2021

Students, parents, staff, special guests and community members gathered in front of their computers to celebrate the 44th annual Colour Night Awards Ceremony on the evening of Monday, June 21st. Eaton students have a long tradition of excellence in the academics, arts and athletics. Since 1977, Eaton Staff has been proud to recognize the students in Grades 7 through 12 for their special skills, abilities and talents. A special thank you to the various groups who make it possible for our students to receive Special Awards, Bursaries and Scholarships and to those who took time to make videos for us to use in our virtual presentation.

*Academic Awards are presented to students on a regular academic program based upon marks on the third report card for Grades 10-12.

Secondary students (Gr. 10-12) will receive an Academic Award if they meet the following criteria: a minimum academic average of 80.00% based upon Quarter 3 marks and/or Semester 1 final marks. The average is calculated using the highest English, Math, Science and Social marks, plus the two highest marks in elective subjects taught at Eaton School in which instruction is in excess of 100 minutes in a 6 day cycle.

Highest Academic Average Awards will only be awarded to students in Grades 10, 11 and 12.
