



Reading is the doorway; books are the keys. Participate in the Book Exchange and unlock many doors. Spend some time this month with a few great books.





Sun West 2023-24 Calendar Photography Contest

Sun West is holding a photography contest open to all students, staff and parent/guardians for pictures to be used in the 2023-24 Sun West wall calendar.

Eligibility

The following are eligible to enter pictures in the contest:

- K-12 Sun West students attending Sun West schools between August 2022 and June 2023.
- Anyone employed by Sun West between August 2022 and June 2023.
- Parents of K-12 Sun West students whose children are attending Sun West schools between August 2022 and June 2023.

Entrance requirements

- The deadline for entering pictures is Monday, May 1, 2023 at 12:00 noon.
- Pictures must be submitted to <u>mike.fedyk@sunwestsd.ca</u>
- Eligible individuals are permitted to enter more than one picture.
- Pictures must have been taken between August 25, 2022 and May 1, 2023.
- Pictures must be submitted in a digital format (either JPG or PNG) with the last name and initial of the photographer as the file name. If the photographer is entering more than one picture, they must be numbered. For example, if Joe Smith entered two pictures their files names should be jsmith1 and jsmith2.
- Pictures must be large enough to be printed at 8.5 inches high X 11 inches wide without any pixilation. Most smartphone cameras can take pictures that meet this requirement.
- Pictures must be taken in landscape format (horizontal). As indicated in the picture below:



- Each picture entered must be accompanied with a completed entry form that includes all the following information:
 - Name of photographer with school they attend, work at or children attend.
 - Date or occasion the picture was taken.

- Indication that the school verified that it has permission to publish form on file for all students in the picture and that the photographer gives their permission for the picture to be used in the calendar and other Sun West promotional materials.
- A brief description of the picture that could be used for a caption for the picture if it is published in the Sun West calendar. An example of a caption could be: "Students from XXXX school celebrate as the senior girls win the provincial championship."

Criteria

A panel of judges will select the winners of the Sun West Photography Contest based on the following criteria:

- Pictures that highlight some element of school life and community including but not limited to:
 - The Sun West Personalized electronically Blended Learning (PeBL) philosophy.
 - Student achievements both curricular and extracurricular and both individuals and groups.
 - School activities and events both inside and outside classrooms and school buildings.
 - Daily school activities and events.
 - School clubs, teams and organizations.
 - Special days and celebrations such as Pink Shirt Day, Orange Shirt Day, first day of school, Christmas, etc.
 - Activities and events that engage parents/guardians and community members with schools.
 - School Community Councils and their activities/events.
 - The employment-related activities, events and achievements of Sun West staff.
- Pictures must highlight people. Pictures that are primarily of landscapes or nature will
 not be considered. Pictures can feature students with their artwork or other kinds of work
 but a picture of artwork or other work alone will not be considered.
- While individuals can enter as many pictures as they wish, each picture entered must be distinct. Multiple versions of the same picture will not be considered.

Prizes

Prize-winning pictures will be featured in the 2023-24 Sun West Calendar and will receive a gift card to a business of their choice (such as Tim Horton's, Amazon, Apple, Cabellas, Best Buy, Indigo etc). These are the available prizes.

JANUARY EVENTS

The Board held a long-term planning session on January 10 at a Committee of the Whole Meeting. The session included all Trustees as well as senior management. This was part of the process of developing a new multi-year Education Plan that will also include a stakeholder survey that will be provided to schools and School Community Councils.

The Board also held its regular meeting on January 24. Highlights included:

- The Student Support Services Report was provided. While demands on Student Support Services are increasing, Sun West has measures in place to insure the needs of students are met.
- The Board endorsed the initial priority actions and milestones of the Provincial Education Plan 2023-2030.
- Sun West will be participating in Year 2 of the Parent Teacher Home Visits Initiative Pilot. Participating schools will be Westberry Elementary School, Biggar Central School 2000 and Walter Aseltine School.



FEBRUARY EVENTS

The Board held its regular meeting on February 14 in Rosetown. Highlights included:

- The Board authorized the Sun West Distance Learning Centre (DLC) to offer Summer School classes as it has in past years.
- The Board received a report on DLC course completion. Sun West students in DLC courses had a 86% completion rate.
- The Board discussed and supported a proposal from the Director of Education to encourage more Sun West students to become part of the Duke of Edinburgh Awards program.
- The Board discussed a proposal from the President of the West Central District Athletic Association to provide ongoing support for extracurricular athletics within Sun West.
