



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It's P.A.R.T.Y. Time!!!!

On May 24th, 2023, the Grade 10 students from Kindersley, Eatonia, Eston, Marengo, and Leader schools will participate in the P.A.R.T.Y. program in Kindersley. We are very grateful for all the community involvement to make this day possible.

P.A.R.T.Y. stands for Preventing Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth. Throughout the day, the Grade 10 students will experience what it is like to be in the place of an injury survivor. The day starts with an opening presentation where students gain a better understanding of what it means to take a risk, how to make an informed decision about risk-taking behavior and strategies to help prevent injury. They will then attend a mock crash followed by small group presentations by the RCMP, Addictions, Physiotherapy, <u>EMS</u> and the Funeral Home. The day will conclude with an injury ambassador speaking about their injury and what life has been like since their incident and leaving the students with a message of hope and resilience. During the lunch, students will be given a scenario and will try to eat with a simulated injury.

It is a very impactful day, leaving the students thinking about their choices and the risks they are willing to take!



Discover Scuba








Grade 1&2 News

Students are learning about the famous artist Van Gough. They are extremely proud to share their Spring blossom trees!










Gymnastics

Working together is key in Gymnastics! Grades 1-4 show their talented skills.












Gr. 3/4

In science we have been learning about light and shadows. We created shadow puppets and presented them this month.












Gr. 5/6

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

APRIL 2023 EDITION



On March 28, Sun West held an Online Public Meeting that included a video introduced by the Sun West Student Leadership group (left) that highlighted student success. The meeting was recorded and is available on the Sun West website. Topics covered included: Personalized Goals, Grade Alike Planning (GAP), Parent Teacher Home Visits Initiative, Mental Health and Wellness, Power Play and SCC celebrations. MARCH EVENTS

The Board held a Committee of the Whole meeting on March 7 and its regular meeting on March 28. Business at these meetings included:

- On March 7, the Board continued working with Saskatchewan School Board Association officials on a complete review of Board policies.
- On March 28, the Board approved the 2023-24 school year calendar based on the recommendations of the Calendar Committee that included representatives from students, SCCs and most employee groups. The calendar still requires approval from the Ministry of Education.
- The Board approved an agreement with the provincial government to become an Accountable Partner to oversee establishing an Early Years Family Resource Development Centre in Kindersley. Sun West will work with other partners to share in the development of the Centre.



Every year, Grades 9-12 Sun West students are eligible to apply for subsidies to attend the Canadian Student Leadership Conference, this year taking place in New Brunswick. A Board committee decides who will receive the subsidies and this year has selected nine students from seven schools to represent Sun West at this awesome conference. These students will make a presentation about the conference to the Board later in the year.
