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Eaton School Highlights from 2022-2023

The end of a new school year is here?!?! Boy, did the 2022-2023 school year fly by! It is only fitting that we take a look back at the many highlights that occurred this past year and celebrate the successes of Eaton School, our students and staff.

- Eaton School has made progress and continues to strive for further growth and success in the areas of personalized learning, family and community engagement, and mental wellness. Our dedicated staff work to make our school a welcoming place for all students.
- At the start of the school year, teachers identified any gaps in Reading, Writing, and Math. Personalized Goals in these areas were created for Gr 1-9 students in late fall and communicated with parents/guardians. A plan of action was developed and worked on throughout the remainder of the school year to support students in the successful realization of their personalized goals.
- Staff members have always provided students with many extra-curricular opportunities. Extra-curricular activities span Grade 1 to 12 with the majority in the Middle Years and High School. These include 6-Man Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Soccer, Track and Field, Power Hour, Drama, GSA, Yearbook, SRC, Team Sun West and the Sun West Youth Consultation Group. This is possible with the commitment of staff, the volunteerism of community coaches, and forming co-ops with other local schools.
- Of special note, Eaton School has created an outdoor learning space with the incredible support of our community, corporate and private donations, and many, many hours of volunteer labour. The Spartan Outdoor Space (S.O.S.) provides students with the opportunity to take learning out of the building into the outdoors and appeals to our kinesthetic learners. Learning in the Outdoor Space promotes the study of horticulture and agriculture which are a focus within the community of Eatonia and surrounding area.
- This year, Eaton School was one of only 36 schools to be awarded a \$5000 grant by the Canadian Playful Schools Network (CPSN) Eaton School's focus for this grant was to make an incredible Spartan Agricultural and Indigenous Outdoor Play Space. The goal was to provide opportunities for students to be engaged in learning about the land and Indigenous perspectives and for teachers to teach content in a hands-on way.
- A SWAY was created for daily announcements to increase communication amongst staff, students and parents. Staff all have editing permission to add announcements. A link was provided to parents so they can check announcements digitally as children don't always pass along what is happening at school. A very positive response about this SWAY was received from parents and the SCC.
- Both a Meet the Teacher Night and a Family Literacy Night were held this year.
- Tri-Conferences Eaton always has an excellent turnout for Conferences. This year, 96% of families engaged in a meeting with their child (ren)'s teacher(s) in person or via a phone conversation in October and 98% participated in March.
- The MADD Smartwheels RV Presentation for the Gr 4-6 students was very educational.
- During Education Week, Marcella Bird, Liz Zdunich and Kelli Boklischak came to Eaton to look at a display of Indigenous artifacts that we have at Eaton School. Marcella spoke with Gr 1-6 classes about the artifacts and shared her knowledge. Liz engaged Gr 1/2 and 7/8/9 students in dot painting.
- Eaton School Land Acknowledgment statement was created through a process which involved staff, students, SCC and parents.
- Lyndon Linklater joined Eaton School students and staff to assist with setting up the tipi. He passed on tipi teachings and his knowledge to students and staff.
- SCC First Annual Staff/SCC Vs. Graduating Students slow-pitch game was a hit and we are looking forward to next year's game.
- We held a Mock Interview Day that provided practice job interviews with Gr 5-12 students and business owners in the community which gave students a look at real-world applications.
- Two successful plays put on by the Eaton School drama club one at Christmas and one in May.
- The return of Super Happy Fun Time was specifically designed to build school culture and encouraged school spirit and co-operation amongst the traditional school teams of Emerald, Hematite and Sapphire.
- We hosted a stretch/mobility clinic led by Tammy Nunweiler for school and community athletes.
- Eaton Gr 7/8s continued with the Young Entrepreneurs program (PowerPlay) and another successful business fair. Our PowerPlay team was invited to the PowerPlay Innovation Day and to the PowerPlay Showcase.

- We enjoyed the full return of many school-community events after the COVID disruption including: Hallowe'en carnival, SCC bingo, Christmas concert, Strawberry Social, SCC family dance, Spartan Turkey Dinner, Elementary Christmas Boogie, SCC Pancake breakfast, Scholastic Book Fair, Hallowe'en Pumpkin carving, Remembrance Day service, curling, etc. Community members contributed a lot to the school through coaching and volunteering at these events.
- Students were fortunate to see great performers and guest speakers including Illumidance, Tammy Nunweiler, Cody Deaner, Dance Saskatchewan, D Jay McGrath, Brian Kirkness, Liza Dahl, etc.
- A successful Band trip to the Cantando Music Festival goes in the books.
- RCMP School Liaison Office participated in a school lockdown. Constable Chen also spoke with Gr 5-12 students regarding the legalities of social media.
- Grad 2023 9 Grade 12 students achieved Graduation status.
- Many field trips, including: SCUBA diving for 11/12 Phys Ed., Steve Mealey tribute concert for junior and senior bands, farm to table trips for grade 3/4, Kindergarten trip to Fire Hall and to Dearborn's Farm, North Battleford trip for grade 3/4, Luseland trip for grade 5/6, grade 5-8 Wanuskewin Trip and Grade 1/2 field trip to Becker Farms and to Kindersley for hiking and bowling.
- Grade 5/6 planned, organized, communicated and collaborated to put on an incredibly well-run Track and Play Day for Kindergarten to Grade 4 students. They were supported by staff, SCC and parents.
- We welcomed next year's Kindergarten students by inviting them to join the current Kdgn class for an afternoon and to bring their parents to a "Meet the Teacher" evening to learn about Kindergarten expectations.
- Facility improvements including installation of permanent wall mats in the gym, a digital wall clock for the gym (pending), installation of new playground equipment, etc.
- The annual Colour Night Awards Ceremony recognized students for their academic, athletic, and arts achievements. We also recognized staff for their commitment of time to student activities. Graduates received scholarships and bursaries. Eaton School is very proud of each and every one of their students' accomplishments.
- The School Community Council continued to support Eaton and engage families by hosting a Pancake Breakfast, a BBQ, a reading challenge, a book exchange, a Bingo, monthly healthy snacks, a family dance, and more.

As you can tell, Eaton students had a great year of learning, both in and outside of the classroom, and growing! With the warm days of summer upon us, everyone is very much looking forward to a couple of months to relax and recharge. Enjoy your summer and we will see you again in the fall!
