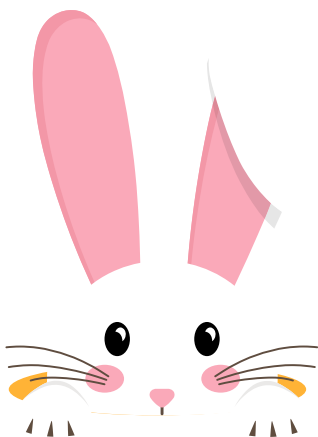

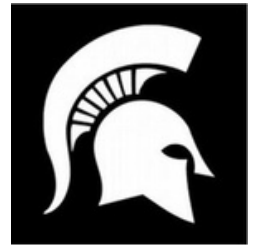

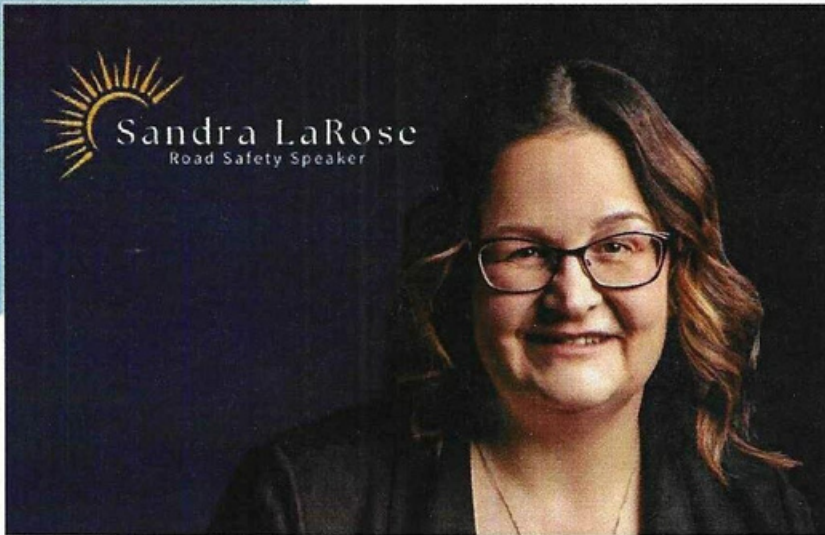
Please pass this information on to parents who do not have any students in school or do not follow social media.

Kailynn's Story

A 10 second glance away from the road can change your life forever.

August 16, 2018, changed my life forever. My 16-year-old daughter Kailynn was involved in a train vehicle collision near Weyburn, SK, Canada. Fighting for her life for 6 days, Kailynn died from severe head trauma on August 22. She had turned 17 just a day prior. The cause of Kailynn's accident was found to be driver inexperience and distracted driving.

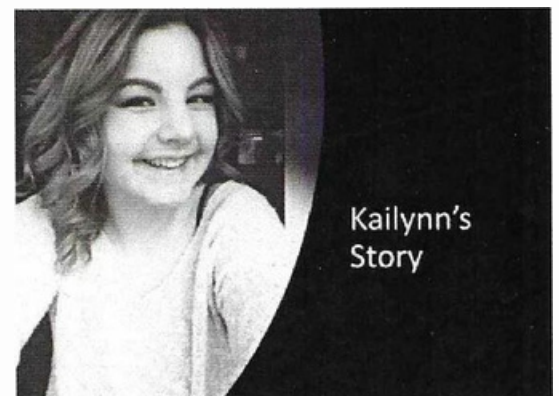
Kailynn's Story is real, heartbreaking, and impactful. My goal in sharing this story is to educate others on how decisions they make when they get into the driver's seat can change their lives forever. Through photos, words, and song, I share my life as it is now, Kailynn's life as it was, and Kailynn's life that she missed out on.

Bio: Sandra is a road safety speaker, advocating for change in people's choices regarding distracted driving. Sandra is founder and president of Sharing Kailynn's Sunshine Foundation, and a Rail Safety Ambassador with Operation Lifesaver Canada. Sandra has been involved with both SGI

(Saskatchewan Government Insurance) and Operation Lifesaver sharing Kailynn's story on both safety platforms. Sandra works full time in Regina helping support students at an adult educational facility. Sandra is a mother of two and lives with her husband on their farm near Tyvan, SK.

What is 18 to Life?

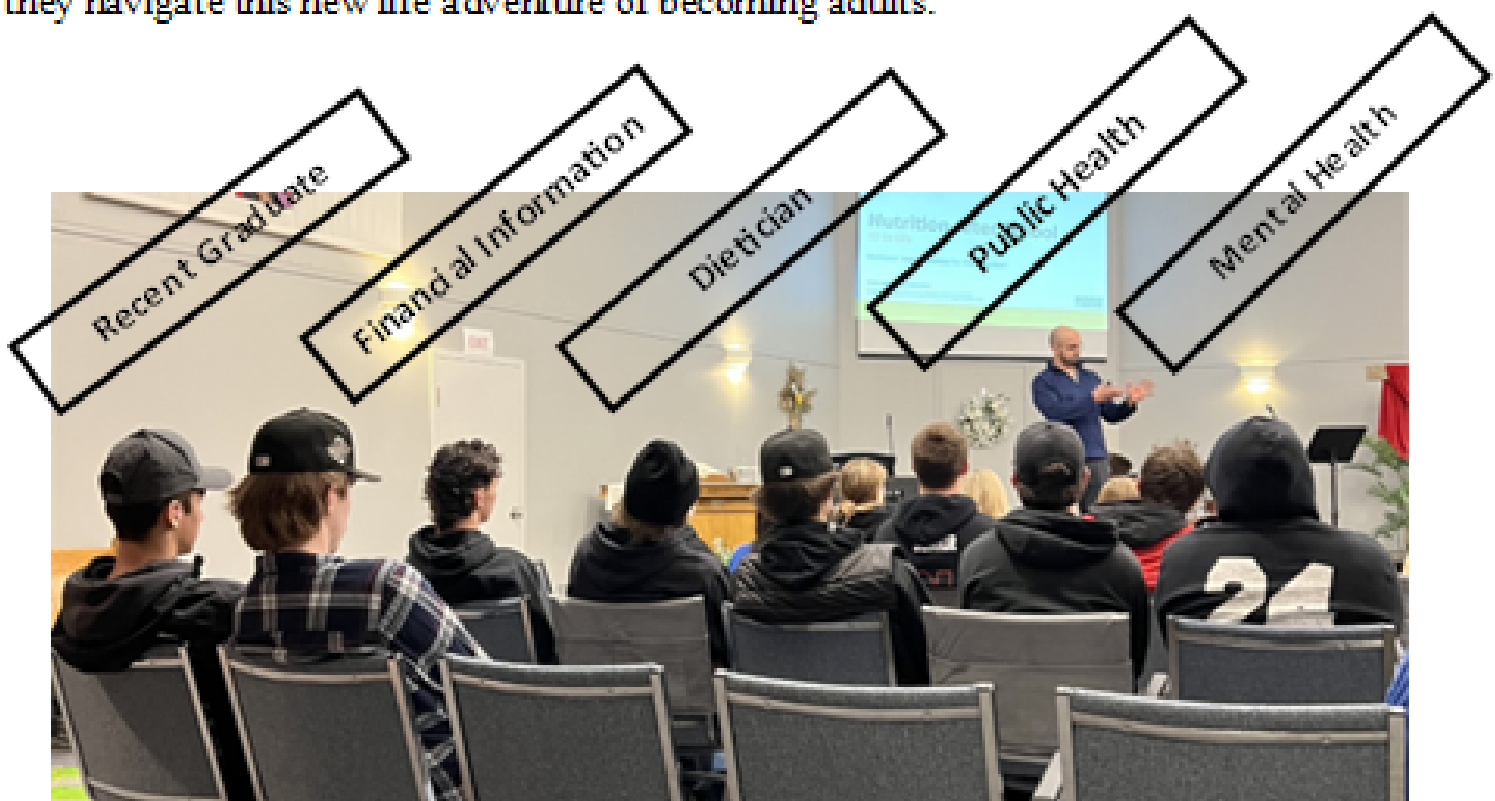
The transition from being a kid in school to being considered an adult upon graduation is a huge change in anyone's life. It can be exciting and overwhelming all at the same time - more responsibilities, opportunities and independence. Can anyone be fully prepared for this transition? Have we as parents, educators, health systems and communities done all we can to assist our youth in making that transition successful? These are the questions we have asked ourselves as students themselves are expressing their need to know more about what is to come and how they can prepare themselves as best they can.

18 to Life is a partnership between the Sun West School Division and the Saskatchewan Health Authority to help students learn about life skills they may need as they move onto post secondary education or the workforce. It is reported that youth and young adults between the ages of 15 to 24 are more at risk of suffering from a mental health illness or substance abuse than any other age group (Pearson, Janz and Ali (2013). This can especially be true as young people are moved out of their comfort zones, have new found independence and responsibilities and in many instances, are far away from their long-time support systems.

As a community partnership, 18 to Life strives to equip Grade 12 students with information and tools necessary after graduation for them to choose healthier lifestyle habits as they navigate this new life adventure of becoming adults.
