Hot Spot Monitoring

With recent increases in break-ins in certain RM locations, new patrol hot spots have been identified. RCMP will continue targeted patrols and work with residents to report suspicious activity quickly.

Crime Prevention Techniques

- -Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) improving lighting, visibility, and layout of properties.
- -Rural Property Crime Watch Program (RPCWP) neighbours watching out for neighbours, sharing updates, and reporting suspicious activity.
- -Community education through RCMP presentations and local engagement.

Tips to Keep Rural Property Secure

- -Keep lights on a timer inside your home.
- -Install an alarm system with a siren.
- -Never leave keys in vehicles or garages.
- -Use signage such as Rural Crime Watch or surveillance notices.
- -Install cameras covering your driveway and entrances.
- -Lock gates, sheds, and barns each night.
- -Consider a tracking device for high-value farm equipment.
- -Always report suspicious activity right away to 911 or your local detachment.

Eatonia Cemetery: History in Our Midst

1921

Records indicate town officials approved the Saskatchewan land surveyor's initial mapping of the Eatonia cemetery. The original vision of those pioneers, in the layout of five blocks for graves with designated road plans, exists today. Seven areas specified for flower beds suggest an ambitious beautification plan to honour the departed. Records of plot purchases and deaths were maintained in the "big black book," though these entries are occasionally incomplete by modern standards.

1978

Local historian and volunteer Bill Wardill drew a large version of the map to be used to visually record information. It is preserved on the wall in the town office . . . evidence of his legacy of years of care for the cemetery.

2021

One hundred years later, Jim and Belva Martin undertook a huge project to update the map and provide a framework for future record keeping. It included extensive research, approval by the Saskatchewan Registrar of Cemeteries, and employment of a professional mapping company. The project was completed in 2023 with the addition of a new colourful map on the wall in the town office.

New in 2025

- 1. Paving of the roads
- Erection of the shelter constructed by Kelly Dearborn and helpers to house the map
- Installation of the cemetery map with a directory in remembrance of those departed.


For another year, we acknowledge the congenial cooperative working relationship with the town council and employees as we strive to create a beautiful, enduring sanctuary of peace.






Top Left: 1921 original map; flower beds marked with *
